Sunday Gospel Reflection (Jn 15:1-8)

Saint Catherine of Siena Memorial - Monday, April 29th

One of the four women honored with the title of Doctor of the Church, Catherine was born in Siena, Italy in 1347. She joined the Dominican Third Order, corresponded with people from all walks of life, even counseling princes and popes. This great Christian Mystic was canonized in 1461 (*livingwithchrist.ca*). Her book, *The Dialogue* has become a classic of spiritual literature. It describes the entire spiritual life through a series of conversations between God and the soul.

Saints Philip and James, Apostles Feast - Friday, May 3rd - Mass at 8 am

Philip and James were apostles of Jesus. The choice of **Philip** as a disciple is recorded in Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's Gospel records several conversations between Jesus and Philip ... **James**, the son of Alphaeus is mentioned in Mark and in Acts, and is the author of the canonical epistle. According to historians, he was a Christian of high repute and died a martyr's death by stoning about the year 62. (*livingwithchrist.ca*)

What is the difference between an apostle and a disciple?

The **'disciple'** (from the Latin *discere*, meaning 'to learn') is one who follows the teaching of the teacher and makes it part of his or her life.

The **'apostle'** (from the Greek *apostello*, meaning 'one who is sent out') is the one who has been sent forth. In the Pauline letters 'apostle' means one who has been a witness of the Risen Lord and has been sent by Him to proclaim His Resurrection.

An Update from the St. Michael Refugee Support Team (RST)

Finally, finally, we think for sure, our Rohingya refugee family have their exit permits from India, their visas to Canada and their flights are booked. Please keep Abu, Rabiya, and their three children in your prayers as they travel to Canada, arriving in Toronto on May 2nd. They are coming to a new country and will have so much to learn! We will keep you posted!

The parish is also sponsoring a young Syrian man currently in Iraq. He is waiting for his security clearance and flight to be arranged. Please pray that he will soon be reunited with his family in Kitchener.

The St. Michael RST has been given the go-ahead by the Office for Refugees at the Diocese to begin the process of sponsorship for another family. This is a family of 5 (parents and 3 teenage children) who left Syria years ago. Many of the mother's siblings live in Kitchener and they are anxious to be reunited. Sponsorship takes time – average processing times by IRCC from Egypt are around 4 years. Please pray that the family in Egypt remains healthy and hopeful as the application progresses through the system.
