The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin *- every eye shall see him*.


CORPUS CHRISTI

On Sunday, June 2nd, we celebrate the *Feast of Corpus Christi* – the Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is an opportune time to review our practices around the reception of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

FAST – we are encouraged to fast from food and drink (except water) for one hour before receiving Holy Communion.

DISPOSITION – we should recognize the immense gift given to us in the Eucharist and the privilege we have of sharing in it.

CONFESSION – if we are aware of serious, or even mortal sins, we should celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



How to receive?

The reception of Holy Communion is governed by particular law established by the Canadian Conference of Bishops and by the local Bishop. In his Pastoral Letter on the celebration of the liturgy in the Diocese of Hamilton, Bishop Crosby reminds us of how we are expected to receive Holy Communion at Mass. Namely, as we approach the minister distributing Holy Communion - usually as the person in front of us is receiving - we make a *simple* bow of the head in reverence for the gift we are about to receive. There is no need to genuflect or make a profound bow. Then, standing before the minister, there are two ancient ways for receiving Holy Communion - in the hand or on the tongue. The minister, holding up the Sacred Host says, The Body of Christ, and we say audibly - "Amen." Then we either open our hands or our mouth to receive. If we receive in our hand, we immediately take the Sacred Host and place it in our mouth. We do not walk away without receiving, take the Sacred Host with us to our pew.

Reverence the Blessed Sacrament

When we pass in front of the Tabernacle, or go into our pew, it is customary to *genuflect* or bow in reverence. At the Cathedral Parish we have the custom of the whole assembly standing as

the Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle after the distribution of Holy Communion. All are seated when the Tabernacle doors close.

Communion to the Sick

If you wish to take Holy Communion to a relative who is sick at home please speak with Father Wynen prior to Mass – there is a special container and prayers for Communion to the Sick.

SACRED HEART OF JESUS

June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion has deep roots in the lift of the Church. In Sacred Scripture, the love of God for the human family is presented like the love of a mother for her infant (Is 40.14-15); like a husband for his wife (Hosea 1-2). God has written his loving plan upon the human heart. In John's Gospel, blood and water flowed from Jesus' pierced side – a sign of the birth of the Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque Church. received apparitions of Jesus and began encouraging devotion to His Sacred Heart. Her work was ultimately approved by the Church in her canonization in 1920. The Lord made promises through Margaret Mary to all who have devotion to His Sacred Heart: grace for their state of life, peace in their homes, comfort in affliction, find in his heart an infinite ocean of mercy. In the month of June, let us entrust our lives to the Sacred Heart of Jesus - fount of mercy and love - to sustain us and help us grow in love for God and neighbour.
