FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

(Second Reading: Revelation 7:9, 14b-17)

Human hearts long to hear words of comfort and assurance like those proclaimed at the end of the second reading from the Book of Revelation. During times of crisis, periodic woundedness, and daily struggle, we all need a pledge that tears will be wiped from our eyes and that one who loves us will forever shelter us. Though written to Christians enduring persecution and written in a way that hides its true meaning from the persecutors while making it available to believing readers, the Book of Revelation contains a timeless message. It asserts that those who oppose God's work will not prevail, that suffering, even martyrdom, will lead to new and greater life than we could ever have imagined. It assures those who suffer that they have not been forgotten, no matter how many circumstances might declare that falsehood.

In the heavenly throne room, a "great multitude" worships God and "the Lamb," who readers would immediately recognize as Christ. The "elder" explains that those dressed in white are faithful believers who did not let the sword compromise their faith. They have mingled their blood with the blood of the Lamb, and that blood has washed them clean. Forever now, they are privileged to stand in the presence of the divine Lamb where no form of deprivation or suffering will ever touch them.
