

Reflection on the First Reading (Acts 5:12-16)

In the beginning of Acts, Luke's summary of the ideal Christian life demonstrates the result of faith in Christ: a community of one heart and one mind. Spiritual needs are cared for in common through the apostles' teaching, the prayers, the meal, and the common life. Material needs are answered by the sharing of possessions. The apostolic community of the Twelve is a magnet that draws believers, enlivened by the Holy Spirit, to share their experience of the Risen Christ.

Luke describes the life of the nascent community and extols the spirit of communion and healing: "they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on cots and mats in order that Peter's shadow might fall on some of them... and they were all cured." The healings were the proof of the community's identity with Jesus, who, at the beginning of his ministry in the Nazareth synagogue, identified himself as the healer of a world
