

The Second Reading from 1 Peter 2:20-25

This reading from this epistle attributed to St. Peter is thought to be part of an early Christian hymn based on the fifty-third chapter of Isaiah (53:4-12) that describes the lot of a "suffering servant" sent by God to heal the world. The author names Christ as this servant, who undergoes suffering without returning any sort of retribution. Christ is depicted here as the perfect model of suffering. The author's point is to remind Christians that while Christ's suffering was undertaken in their name, they must be willing to patiently endure similar suffering in their present day reality. The ability to suffer along with Christ is both a grace and something Christians are called to by God.

What are the practical ways in which a Christian must patiently endure suffering? The author provides several answers: commit no sin, speak no words of deception, offer no insult when insulted, and make no threat when threatened. The proper response to all things that will test the patience of a Christian is to surrender the self just as Christ freely gave himself over to 'the one who judges justly.' This just judge is his own Father, and thus, suffering is to be seen as an offering of love.

The reading ends with a call to 'live for righteousness,' which is made possible because Christians have been healed by Christ's suffering. The suffering servant is now likened to a shepherd who is faithful in watching over his flock. The author accuses his readers of having once wandered from the flock but have now returned to the fold. The Greek word here for 'guardian' is episkopos, the word used for 'bishop.' Thus, this early Christian hymn can be understood to be a profession of belonging both to Christ and to the authority of the Church.

PRAYERS STRAIGHT FROM THE BIBLE - CANTICLES:

The Firstborn of all Creation - Colossians 1:12-20

Let us give thanks to the Father, who has made us worthy to share in the inheritance of the saints in light.

He rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of His beloved Son. Through Him we have redemption, the forgiveness of our sins.

He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creation, for in Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, thrones and dominations, principalities and powers.

All things were created through Him and for Him: He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.

And He is the head of the body, the Church. He is the beginning, the first-born from the dead, and so He is pre-eminent above all.

For it was the Father's will that the fullness of God should dwell in Him, and that through Him all things should be reconciled to Himself. Through the blood of the Cross He brought peace to all things, both on Earth and in the heavens.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

The heart of the hymn consists of verses 15-20, into which Christ enters directly and solemnly as the "image" of "the invisible God". The Greek term *ekon*, "icon", is dear to the Apostle: in his Letters he uses it nine times, applying it both to Christ, the perfect icon of God and to man, the image and glory of God.

However, by sin, men and women "exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images representing mortal man" (Rom 1: 23), choosing to worship idols and become like them. We must therefore continuously model our being and life on the image of that of the Son of Go, so that we may be "delivered... from the dominion of darkness" and "transferred... to the Kingdom of his beloved Son" (Col 1: 13).

This is a first imperative in this hymn: to model our life on the image of the Son of God, entering into His sentiments, His will and His thoughts. (From Vatican.va - Pope Benedict XVI - Sep 7, 2005)
