Reflection on the Reading at the Procession with Palms:

Jesus approaches Jerusalem by way of the Mount of Olives and asks two disciples to bring a donkey with its foal. With these two details, the evangelist signals that what is about to happen points to the fulfillment of prophecy and of Israel's greatest hope. Zechariah proclaimed that at the culmination of God's plan, the Lord would stand upon the Mount of Olives, and God's Anointed, as humble king and saviour, would arrive "riding on a donkey". Jesus instructs the disciples charged with bringing the animals that if anyone questions them, they are simply to reply that the "master" needs them. Matthew uses the word *kyrios*, which can also mean "lord," used often as a title of authority and divinity.

As Jesus enters the City of David, the crowds pay him homage according to custom, spreading their cloaks and palm branches before him. Matthew underscores that this act signifies the arrival of God's chosen Messiah, an expected new Son of David who would restore people, nation, and kingship under his righteous rule. They cry out the words of Psalm 118, part of the thanksgiving liturgy that accompanied a victory procession of Israel's king and people to the Temple of their God, shouting "Hosanna," which means "Lord grant salvation!"

To the ruling power of Rome, Jesus' actions and the people's response signalled a highly volatile situation: a man whom Jewish crowds hailed as king and liberator, entering Jerusalem as multitudes gathered to celebrate the feast of Passover, God's deliverance from oppression. The empire would soon move to eliminate this latest challenge to its absolute rule. But Matthew focuses on proclaiming the religious meaning of this event: the one whom Rome will soon crucify as a threat to its supremacy is, in fact, Israel's chosen Messiah, inaugurating the Lord's final rule as humble servant, not as dominating force.
