

Reflection on the First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

On this third Sunday of Advent, the reading from Isaiah adds to our sense of joy on this Gaudete (rejoice) Sunday. The greater part of the book of Isaiah focuses on the impending destruction of the kingdom of Judah for their transgressions against God. Yet doom is not the final word for God's people. In today's reading, Isaiah rejoices in God because he has received salvation and justice from God. After a period of captivity and suffering, God grants His favour not only upon the Prophet but also on all His people.

In fact, Isaiah is called to "bring good news to the oppressed," the broken-hearted, and the captives. The marginalized and imprisoned are singled out to emphasize the magnitude and graciousness of God's redemptive activity that allows them to have new life in Him. This revival of God's people is represented by the new life of "righteousness and praise" that springs from the ground: God's people have been shackled and now are set free that they, too, might rejoice in the Lord.

We rejoice today in our new life in proper relationship with God that was ushered in by Jesus' Incarnation. We recognize God's salvific activity in every aspect of our lives. Like Isaiah and the ancient Israelites, God's redemptive movement in our lives has enlivened us so that we are free to praise God "before all the nations." (From the workbook for Lectors)

"Has anybody the right to criticize us even if we seem to be beside ourselves with joy to-day over the birthday of our King?" If the princes and rulers of this world are privileged to make merry over the sons of their flesh, what a mountain of reasons we have for exulting over the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, our Saviour!



The Third Week of Advent Represents: Joy Candle Name: Shepherd's Candle. Color: Pink This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

Scripture Reflection: "And the shepherds

returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them." Luke 2:20

Prayer: Dear Jesus, help us focus on you during this busy season. May we stay aware of the joy you bring into our lives. We want to find you in the everyday moments and come with hearts of gratitude to your manger on Christmas. Amen.

The Fourth Week of Advent Represents: Love

Candle Name: the Angel's Candle. Color: Purple

During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel.

Scripture Reflection: "And the angel said to them, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:10-11

Prayer: Dear Jesus, may the light of your love always shine in our hearts. As Christmas draws closer, we marvel at your great love for us. Let your love transform every aspect of our lives and touch everyone we encounter. Our hearts are open to you, Jesus. Amen.

(Advent is short this year as the 4th Sunday is on Christmas Eve, therefore you might wish to anticipate each week and that is why we publish reflections for two weeks at a time.) (From dynamiccatholic.com)

The Special Antiphons – (An antiphon is a verse that gives emphasis to what follows, such as a prayer, psalm, Scripture or canticle.) From Dec. 17th to 23rd of each Advent season, a special antiphon known as an O Antiphon is read before the *Magnificat* during evening prayer or before the gospel at Mass. Sometimes called the Greater

Antiphons, or the O's of Advent (because they begin with that exclamation), the O Antiphons differ from the daily antiphons because they herald the coming birth of Christ. Originally written in Latin around the seventh or eighth centuries, these special antiphons are verses extracted from the Old Testament prophets — namely, Isaiah — and express the longing for the coming of the Christ. In fact, the word "come" is used in every O Antiphon.

Each of the seven antiphons begins by addressing Jesus using an Old Testament title for the Messiah. These seven names or titles, all from the Book of Isaiah, are:

Dec. 17, O' Sapientia (O Wisdom), Isaiah 11:2-3.

O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation.

Dec. 18, O' Adonai (O Lord or Ruler), Isaiah 11:4-5 and 33:22. O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai Mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.

Dec. 19, O' Radix (O Root of Jesse), Isaiah 11:1.

O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.

Dec. 20, O' Clavis (O Key of David), Isaiah 22:22.

O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling at your will the gate of heaven: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom.

Dec. 21, O' Oriens (O Radiant Dawn), Isaiah 9:1.

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

Dec. 22, O' Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations), Isaiah 2:4. O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, come, and save the creature you fashioned from the dust.

Dec. 23, O' Emmanuel (O God with Us), Isaiah 7:14.

O Emmanuel, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God.

If you take the first letter of each Latin name and reverse the order — that is, begin with E from Emmanuel, then Rex Gentium and so on you will spell the word EROCRAS, which in Latin means "I shall come tomorrow." (From simplycatholic.com)

Resurrection Vocation Minute - But the truth is, God's will for us is not for God, but for us. God wants you to rejoice always, pray without ceasing (this doesn't mean constantly saying prayers, but always being present), and to give thanks in all circumstances. The things God will ask you to do will change, but God's will for you has always been the same. Read more at www.resurrectionists.ca


