

Reflection on the First Reading: Isaiah 63:16b-17; 64:1,3-8

5:00 PM

Today's reading from Isaiah marks the beginning of our Advent journey toward the birth of Christ. The passage begins and ends with an emphasis on god as our father, providing a relational framework for understanding the rest of the reading. Unfortunately, it is a relationship that is marked by brokenness. Isaiah contrasts the reality of Israel wandering and turning away from God with the recognition that God is deserving of our awe and reverence. Indeed, if the mountains quake in God's presence, how much more should we respond with awe to God's presence in our lives?

Not only does Isaiah point to nature as an indicator of what is owed to God, he also speaks of the "awesome deeds" that God performed on behalf of His people. This is a reference to the Exodus out of Egypt and God's providence during the wilderness wanderings, including the giving of the commandments on Mount Sinai. Despite this overwhelming evidence of God's majesty and power, the Israelites have

Candle name: Prophecy Candle. Colour: Purple. Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

Scripture Reflection: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined." Isaiah 9:2

Prayer: Dear Jesus, you are the hope in our messy world. This Advent, help us slow down, listen to Your voice, and focus on what's really important. We place our hope in You as we prepare our hearts to celebrate Your birth on Christmas, Amen.

The Second Week of Advent Represents: Peace and Preparation.

Candle Name: Bethlehem Candle. Color: Purple

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

Scripture Reflection: "And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." Luke 2:4-7

Prayer: Dear Jesus, you entered our world on Christmas as the Prince of Peace. This Advent, as we strive to become the-best-version-ofourselves, fill us with a deep and abiding peace. Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter, especially those who need it most. Amen. (From dynamiccatholic.com)

turned away from God in their sins. As a result, God has justifiably "hidden" His face from them. The "hidden God" motif is common in the Psalms and depicts a breakdown in the relationship between God and His people. Yet, the reading does not end on this negative note. Instead, Isaiah calls God father for a second time, recalling that all of Israel is God's creation and that He continues to fashion them according to His will.

This language of penitential piety calls us to engage likewise in repentance and return to God during this Advent season as we prepare our hearts to celebrate the incarnation of Christ. Do we actively remember the times that God has performed "awesome deeds" in our own lives? In what ways do we allow God to shape our lives and inform our actions in our day-to-day lives? (From the workbook for Lectors)

Immaculate Conception refers to the special way in which the Virgin Mary herself was conceived. Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

490 To become the mother of the Saviour, Mary "was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role." The angel Gabriel at the moment of the

annunciation salutes her as "full of grace". In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace.

491 Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854:

The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.

493 The Fathers of the Eastern tradition call the Mother of God "the All-Holy" (*Panagia*), and celebrate her as "free from any stain of sin, as though fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature". **By the grace of God Mary remained free of every personal sin her whole life long.** "Let it be done to me according to your word. . ."

492 The "splendour of an entirely unique holiness" by which Mary is "enriched from the first instant of her conception" comes wholly from Christ: she is "redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son". The Father blessed Mary more than any other created person "in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" and chose her "in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before Him in love".
