

Reflection on the First Reading on Sunday: Genesis 9:8-15

This reading – the first of three exploring baptismal imagery – comes from the end of the flood account in Genesis where God establishes the first unequivocal covenant (*berit* in Hebrew) with humanity. Covenants establish deep bonds between/among the parties that enter into them, and they always consist of explicit terms (usually behaviour based) that benefit all parties involved. In most cases, signs or symbolic actions establish the covenant and/or remind participants of the covenant in the future. The covenant of Christian marriage, for example, is established in the sacramental celebration of matrimony and is recalled in the sign of wedding rings worn by the couple.



In the case of biblical flood, God anticipates the covenant made in today's reading before the flood with a promise to protect Noah, his descendants, and all living things on the earth, as well as every food (Gen. 6:18-21). In view of this promised covenant, Noah remains faithful to God's commands by building and filling the ark. Today's first reading then demonstrates God's faithfulness through the establishment of the foretold covenant. Noah, his descendants, and every living thing on the earth will never again be subject to a global flood. Moreover, and notably, only God's actions are restricted by the terms of this covenant, despite the fact that humanity's sins wrought the flood. It is thus possible to see in today's first reading a type or precursor of Baptism in which, through water, God restricts the divine power to extend mercy to sinners in need of forgiveness. We continue to look at Biblical quotations corresponding to the text of the Mass: Liturgy of the Word:

Introductory/Concluding Dialogues:

- "A reading from the book/letter of..." (See: Nehemiah 8:1-8: "Now when the seventh month came, the whole people gathered as one in the square in front of the Water Gate, and they called upon Ezra the scribe to bring forth the book of the law of Moses which the LORD had commanded for Israel. On the first day of the seventh month, therefore, Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. In the square in front of the Water Gate, Ezra read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion; at his right side stood Mattithiah, Shema, Anaiah, Uriah, Hilkiah, and Maaseiah, and on his left Pedaiah, Mishael, Malchijah, Hashum, Hashbaddanah, Zechariah, Meshullam. Ezra opened the scroll so that all the people might see it, for he was standing higher than any of the people. When he opened it, all the people stood. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they knelt down and bowed before the LORD, their faces to the ground. The Levites Jeshua, Bani, Sherebiah, Jamin, Akkub, Shabbethai, Hodiah, Maaseiah, Kelita, Azariah, Jozabad, Hanan, and Pelaiah explained the law to the people, who remained in their places. Ezra read clearly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read." See also Jeremiah 36:8; Acts 13:15; 1 Timothy 4:13)
- "The Word of the Lord" (1 Peter 1:25: "but the Word of the Lord remains forever." This is the Word that has been proclaimed to you.")
- "Thanks be to God" (<u>Rom 6:17</u>: "But thanks be to God that, although you were once slaves of sin, you have become obedient from the heart to the pattern of teaching to which you were entrusted."; <u>2 Cor 9:15</u>: "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!")
- "A reading from the holy Gospel according to..." "Glory to you, O Lord"
- "The Gospel of the Lord" (Mark 1:1: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God", Mark 1:14-15 "After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." Also see Roman 16:25-27)
- "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ" Acclamations before the Gospel:

"Alleluia" (many Psalms, esp. <u>Ps 146-150</u>: "Allelujah! Praise the LORD, my soul; I will praise the LORD all my life, sing praise to my God while I live." Also see: Rev 19:1-6)

- "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory!" (<u>Psalm 24:7-10:</u> "Lift up your heads, O gates; be lifted, you ancient portals, that the King of glory may enter. Who is this King of glory? The LORD, strong and mighty, the LORD, mighty in war. Lift up your heads, O gates; rise up, you ancient portals, that the King of glory may enter. Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory." Also see: 1 Thess 2:12; 2 Tim 4:18)

"Praise and honour to you, Lord Jesus Christ!" (compare with <u>Dan 4:34:</u> "Now, I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise and exalt and glorify the King of Heaven, all of whose works are right and ways just; and who is able to humble those who walk in pride." See also <u>Dan 4:37</u>; <u>1 Peter 1:7</u>)
"Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!" (compare with <u>Phil 1:10-11</u> "so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.")
