Reflection on the Second Reading (Titus 2:11-14; 3-4-7)

The first portion of this reading constitutes the heart of the letter to Titus. Possibly it is a confession of faith used in the Baptismal liturgy of the early Church. It contains the main themes of Christian faith and morality – moderation, justice, honesty, piety, hope. The second portion sings of God's saving love through Jesus. Baptism means "rebirth and renewal" in the lives of believers. The term justified means "put on the right track," conforming to the divine plan to transform the children into heirs of eternal life and happiness. Our Saviour's goodness and his love for all people definitely manifested itself in Jesus, who gave his life for us. That plan of salvation is accomplished through Baptism, by which God regenerates us and makes us daughters and sons through the Spirit. Jesus' baptism is the sign and the first step of Christian Baptism.

The **Jordan River** has an upper course from its sources to the Sea of Galilee, and a lower course south of the Sea of Galilee down to the Dead Sea. In traditional terminology, the upper course (or most of it) is commonly referred to as passing through the "Hula Valley"; the Sea of Galilee through which the river passes is a separate entity; and the term Jordan Valley is reserved for the lower course. The river meanders before entering the Dead Sea, a terminal lake about 422 metres below sea level with no outlet.

In the Old Testament, the Jordan river appears as the scene of several miracles, the first taking place when the Jordan, near Jericho, was crossed by the Israelites under Joshua (Joshua 3:15–17). When the feet of the priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant touched the river water, the waters were pushed back in a heap back from the point where they were crossing. The Jordan was also crossed by Elijah and Elisha on dry ground (2 Kings 2:8, 2:14). The prophet and wonder-worker Elisha performed two miracles at the Jordan: he healed Naaman's leprosy by having him bathe in its waters (2 Kings 5:14), and he made an axe head lost by one of the "children of the prophets" float, by throwing a piece of wood into the water (2 Kings 6:6). 
