Parish registration simplifies the process with regard to sponsoring a sacramental candidate; obtaining pastoral references and for preparation of baptisms, weddings and funerals.

Registration is easy and can be completed at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Registration forms are available at the back of the Church.

Parish Records - Our parish records are very important. We try to keep them up to date. Please advise the office of any changes.

Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending. If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

Reflection on the Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

Paul displays the character of the charisms, or spiritual gifts, highlighting how they flow from the grace of the one Spirit. The accent on “the same Spirit,” “the same Lord,” “the same God,” contrasts with the diversity of “gifts,” which are manifestations of the Spirit for the common good. Far from being exclusive rights, everyone shares in the gifts, because “all these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses” for the good of the community. As the gifts and services have their origin in the Holy Spirit, who grants them for the good of all, we are urged to recognize them, give thanks, and accept them in other persons. The Church is no place for envy or ill will about gifts, distributed and received according to God’s will. Recognizing and accepting the diversity of charisms opens the door to union in the Church.

Our Lady Of Lourdes Catholic School Kindergarten Registration for September 2019 will be held: at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic School on Tue., February 5, 2019 at 8:00 – 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 – 6:30 p.m.



The mother, father or legal guardian of the child being registered is asked to be present at the above place and time. The following will be required: a birth certificate, or other legal proof of your child's age, a Catholic Baptismal Certificate of either parent or child, and your child's immunization records. If you are a non-Catholic, but wish to explore a Catholic education for your child(ren), please review the WCDSB Admissions to Catholic Elementary Schools policy: www.wcdsb.ca/about-us/policies-and-administrative-procedures/admissions-to-elementary-school-apa001/. The Immunization of School Pupils Act, 1982 states that the Region of Waterloo Public Health must have a record of your child's immunization in order to attend school in Ontario. School Immunization reporting will now occur online. If you choose not to list immunizations for your child, you must contact the Region of Waterloo Public Health at 519-575-4400 X5003 for exemption information. Parents are encouraged to arrange a visit to a family physician for a hearing and vision screening prior to the child's entry to school. Children with special needs (e.g., speech and language, vision, hearing, intellectual) should register in the school in their home area.
