

Sacramental Life

For Third Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the reading from Isaiah we hear the prophecy for the lands of Zebulun and Naphtali. They were parts of the Northern Kingdom of Israel that had been invaded by and subsumed into the Assyrian empire. Isaiah recalls the pain and shame of that conquest and prophesies a future time of restoration and glory for these lands that eventually became the land of Galilee, west of the Jordan River. What will cause this transformation? Light, "a great light!"

The Corinthians are Paul's spiritual children and they're having problems. The most serious problem, it seems, is a spirit of rivalry and discord within the Christian family. So Paul wastes no time and minces no words. "I appeal to you," he says, in the name of Jesus to get along. He doesn't ask that they try, but that they **do it**. Already, it seems, Paul senses that the greatest scandal the Church can give is dissension among its members.

Paul is far away in Ephesus when, from various sources, he receives the distressing news about Corinth. He's not concerned that some project of his is being undone, but that the Corinthians have lost sight of the meaning of their Baptism. They were baptized in Christ's name, not in Paul's or in that of any of the other early Christian leaders, including Peter. Only Christ died for them, and only He rose from the grave.

Paul is unashamed to profess that he preaches the Gospel without worldly eloquence and depends on God's power to bring good from his efforts. What reader of the word can fail to take comfort in that posture? It is the Cross of Jesus that saves us, not any human effort. Paul affirms that truth.

In the Gospel a great light comes to the lands of Zebulun and Naphtali. Scripture is fulfilled, but the only one who understands that truth has just been cast into

prison. Ironically, the imprisonment of John sets the stage for Jesus's proclamation of the reign of God. Jesus moves to Capernaum in Galilee, a land of prophecy and fulfillment, and also a land of the Gentiles. Here among Gentiles, not in Judea where he was born, Jesus begins his ministry. Matthew heralds the universality of the Good News from the first note of his symphonic narrative that announces Jesus as the Messiah, whom the Gentiles embrace but his own reject

John's arrest at the start of Jesus's ministry foreshadows Jesus's own dire destiny. But the quote from Isaiah establishes a tone of expectancy and fulfillment, for in Jesus something long awaited finally arrives. Jesus undertakes his ministry announcing the, advent of the Kingdom. Like John, Jesus shouts the call for "reform!" The coming of the Kingdom is not a neutral event; it calls for repentance and genuine, lasting conversion.

The Kingdom will need laborers and Jesus immediately sets out to find them. He neither scours the countryside nor summons from the hilltops, but walks along the shore and calls those he sees. He first summons two sets of brothers, all of them fishermen. The truly remarkable aspect of the call of these first Apostles is that they respond "immediately" and leave everything behind—nets, boats, even their father. Jesus enters people's lives and instantly turns them upside down.

Jesus immediately undertakes the activity that will characterize his ministry: "teaching," "proclaiming," and "curing." The Kingdom is here among us and it changes the objective order. The clearest signs of its presence and power are the healings "of every disease and every sickness among the people."


