For the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

(From the First Reading: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19) In a world that permits the taking of life from the womb, the words God speaks to Jeremiah are especially striking: "in the womb, I knew you." Those words suggest much more than God's early selection of Jeremiah as spokesperson "to the nations." It means even more than Jeremiah's being set apart, "consecrated" to the Lord before he was born. Significant as those realities are, they don't compare with being known by God and chosen. Before God gives Jeremiah any title or task, God already is in relationship with him. God was loving Jeremiah, calling Jeremiah to himself, before the boy was born.

Today's portion from Jeremiah leaves out the boy's protest that he is "too young" to undertake this daunting role. That dialogue is the necessary prologue to the pep talk God gives this young recruit for his elite corps of reluctant Prophets. Often, the sign of a true Prophet is his or her unwillingness to accept the role because it is a thankless job that brings more suffering and sorrow than reward. Prophets often did suffer greatly, and at the hands of their own people.

In response to Jeremiah's hesitancy, God undertakes to reassure and steel him for the task he will embrace. The language is strong, almost military. God speaks as if Jeremiah were being prepared for war. In a sense, he is. Jeremiah will indeed fight: his own brothers, a faithless priest and false prophet, and Jewish officials. However, God's promise that opposition will not destroy him is consistently fulfilled.

The final line offers assurance and promises faithfulness, "I am with you." That assurance became a bedrock, divine promise made to all Israel's Prophets and its antecendent was God's unique self-identification to Moses, "I am." Trusting in God puts the impossible within reach. Knowing he is never alone, the Prophet confidently faces hostility and peril. Today we, too, never walk alone.

From the CCCB - This past October 29, the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada (EFC) and the CCCB launched a joint Declaration on Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide at the National Press Gallery in Ottawa on Parliament Hill. The CCCB and EFC were assisted in the launching by Rabbi Dr. Reuven P. Bulka from the Congregation Machzikei Hadas in Ottawa, and Imam Samy Metwally from the Ottawa Main Mosque/Ottawa Muslim Association. At the time of its release, the Declaration had 56 signatories from Catholic, Orthodox, Evangelical, Jewish and Muslim faith leaders across Canada.

The sponsoring signatories to the Declaration, including the CCCB, would now like to make a concerted effort to obtain signatures from a wide spectrum of Canadians who agree with the principles outlined in the Declaration. The EFC and the Jewish and Muslim partners have agreed to do the same. The number of signatures has already grown to 1,961 as of Jan. 7th, including some members from among various mainline Protestant Churches.

The hope is that a significant number of Canadians will sign so that when Catholic, Evangelical, Orthodox, Jewish and Muslim representatives are engaging federal, provincial, territorial or municipal governments on the question of euthanasia and assisted suicide, the Declaration can be used as evidence of the numerous and diverse groups of Canadians who do not support physician-assisted suicide.

This project was developed in consultation with the CCCB Executive Committee and Permanent Council, and the final text was approved by the Executive Committee.
