### For the Epiphany:

The solemnities of the Nativity and Epiphany, together with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, are the three "manifestation" feasts. Epiphany was the original celebration of God's manifestation, and included both Jesus' birth and Baptism. The celebration of Christmas as a manifestation came later, and in the West, eventually became the principal observance of Jesus' birth.

The words of the prophet Isaiah and the example of the magi in the Gospel reading teach us that those who see the glory of the Lord are accountable for what they see. Just as Jerusalem was called to "arise" and be a light tor other nations, we are to proclaim God's glory beyond our church buildings, in the streets and neighbourhoods of our cities and towns. The Lord's glory is so impressive that others want to join in singing God's praises.

Saint Augustine, in an early fifth-century sermon, said, "Recently we celebrated the day on which Christ was born among the Jews; today we celebrate the day, on which He was adored by the Gentiles." Through Christ, God manifested himself to all. Paul understood that the primary purpose of his ministry was to bring Jews and Gentiles together in adoration of Christ Jesus. Both are heirs to His promise. Both are members of the same Body of Christ. In Christ, we are to work through our differences. This endeavour is possible, because God is faithful—the Spirit of Christ remains with us in the work we do.

The story of the magi is rightly most associated with the solemnity of Epiphany. At times, however, placing the emphasis on the details of the number of wise man and the names of their gifts diminishes the importance of the profound truth that the evangelist Matthew sought to convey.

In Matthew's gospel, the wise men, Gentiles, are the first to adore Jesus. However, when Jews, including King Herod, were notified about Jesus' birth, they remained unmoved, even caught up in the political importance of the birth. Matthew's main point in framing his narrative in this way is that in Jesus, God is manifest to the whole world. God's promise of salvation is not reserved to a select few. It is available to all, to be accepted in faith just as the Gentile wise men responded.

At the end of today's Gospel story the wise men went back to their home country. They did not remain basking in the excitement from their adoration of Christ. Rather, their mission began in earnest as they journeyed back home to share their joy of seeing the Christ child.

Guerric of Igny, a twelfth-century French abbot, said, "That which we have celebrated up to today is the birth of Christ, that which we celebrate today is our own birth" (Sermo 14.1). The magi's own birth, as followers of Jesus,



occurred as they offered homage to Jesus. We too, are born as Christians in our act of giving homage to Christ and in bringing His presence to the world.


