People often attend Mass at a parish for months or years without officially registering. Registration here at St. Louis is an expression of your commitment to being an active member of our community. Parish registration simplifies the process with regard to sponsoring a sacramental candidate; obtaining pastoral references and for preparation of baptisms, weddings and funerals.

Registration is easy and can be completed at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Registration forms are available at the back of the Church.

Parish Records - Our parish records are very important. We try to keep them up to date. Please advise the office of any changes.

Music in the Liturgy - Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to join our choirs.

Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending.

If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date. A marriage preparation course is required.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

to all the volunteers who made the 10th Annual Vacation Bible Camp and Lego Robotics Camp possible. We had 48 campers, 11 teen volunteers and 14 adult volunteers during the mornings and 42 campers, 14 teen volunteers and 6 Adult volunteers in the afternoons. The VBS theme was “Shipwrecked: Rescued by Jesus”. We had pirates, tropical islands, boat building, science experiments, music, games, snacks and so much more. And here is what the Captain said: “*They (the campers) be learnin’ that He cares for us, He shelters us, He gives us hope. He is our anchor when we be feelin’ bad. We be learnin’ that the best treasure of them all is the Eucharist, when we receive Jesus.*”

In the afternoons the campers constructed milo robots and car robots which met at a Lego city at the end of each day to perform joint tasks. The campers learned team planning and cooperation in addition to the construction skills. It was a week full of fun, friendship and faith!

OUR LADY OF CANADA, a marble statue created by Lawrence Voaides of Traditional Cut Stone was installed in the outdoor niche on the western wall of the Cathedral Basilica (overlooking the 403), by Joe Costello and team from Clifford Restoration (who did the recent stonework on the Cathedral). The statue was blessed on July 1, 2018. “*Notre Dame du Canada*” was painted by Quebec artist Marius Dubois in 1983. The canvas hangs in Notre Dame Basilica in Montreal and was used with the Prayer of Consecration of Canada during the 150th Anniversary celebrations last year. The wife of the deceased artist gave the Diocese permission to reproduce the image in marble. It is a lasting reminder of the devotional importance of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Canada and in our Diocese!

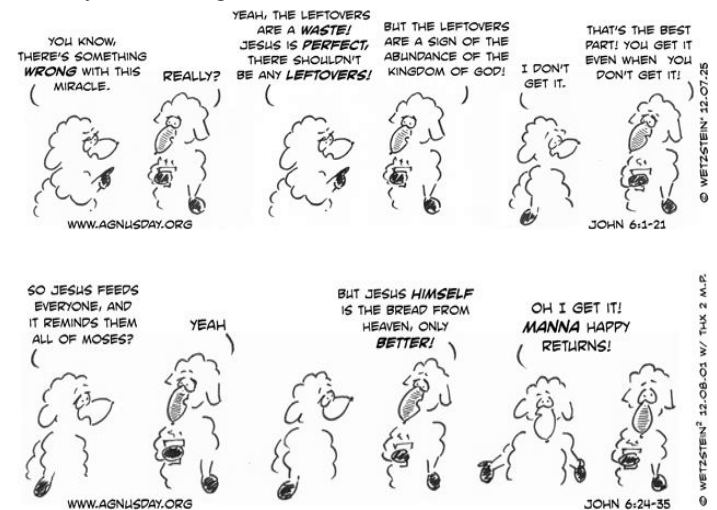
