Registration is easy and can be completed at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Registration forms are available at the back of the Church.

**Sunday programs for children** - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

**Sacramental Life** - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending.

If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

**Baptism** - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation** - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

**Marriage** - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date. A marriage preparation course is required.

**Becoming Catholic** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

**Anointing and Pastoral Care** - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

**Pastoral Care to those in Hospital** - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

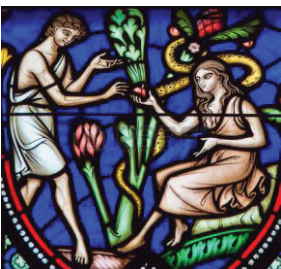

*Reflection on the Genesis 3:8-15 from Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word:*

The author presents a profound understanding of the Creator's chosen way of relating to his creatures: He does not remain aloof, but strolls in the garden and personally speaks with the humans. Even after their sin God does not leave man and woman alone, but approaches them. The consciousness of their nudity betrays the couple's guilt, and they pretend to escape condemnation by shifting blame. Adam blames Eve, who blames the serpent, who provides incentive for the disobedience. God will punish all three, taking no account of their blame shifting, and the punishment will be two-fold for the humans: the weariness of existence and the perennial battle with the seductive influence of the evil one. Human nature will have to await the coming of Christ who, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, will restore human integrity.

Each of the tree punishments – for the snake, woman and man – has a double result: one affecting the individual and the other affecting a basic relationship. The human's response can be seen as a consequence of achieving autonomy; the man is afraid, insecure, and ashamed; he tries to justify himself and deflect the blame onto God for giving him the woman and onto the woman for offering him the fruit. Thus they are alienated from each other. Yet the man admits having eaten. The woman also deflects the responsibility when she lays the blame of the trickery of the serpent, the source of temptation. She too admits having eaten. God proceeds to the sentencing, appropriate to their primary roles in the culture where this text was born, the roles of rank among the animals, female roles of wife and mother, male roles of tiller of the soil and provider of food. The sentence touches marriage and sexuality; birth and death; work and production; human and nonhuman; human and God. Every relationship has been disrupted. Other outcomes include humiliation, domination, and subordination; conflict, suffering, and struggle – all the fruit of sin. The harmony of the garden has been ruptured and death encroaches on life.

Saint Anthony of Padua, born Fernando Martins de Bulhões (15 Aug. 1195 – 13 June 1231), was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things. *(Image: forensic reconstruction. Text: based on Wikipedia article.)*



St. Barnabas, was called Joseph by his Jewish parents, but when he sold all his goods and gave the money to the apostles in Jerusalem, they gave him a new name: Barnabas (meaning "son of consolation"). Book of Acts describes him as a Cypriot Jew, an apostle and a missionary. Following Paul's conversion Barnabas introduced him to the apostles. He and Paul undertook missionary journeys together and participated in the Council of Jerusalem. Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus, in 61 AD. *(Based on Wikipedia article)*

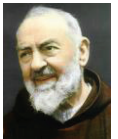
