People often attend Mass at a parish for months or years without officially registering. Registration here at St. Louis is an expression of your commitment to being an active member of our community. Parish registration simplifies the process with regard to sponsoring a sacramental candidate; obtaining pastoral references and for preparation of baptisms, weddings and funerals.

Registration is easy and can be completed at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Registration forms are available at the back of the Church.

Parish Records - Our parish records are very important. We try to keep them up to date. Please advise the office of any changes.

Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending. If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date. A marriage preparation course is required.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

FOR THE 10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

(1 Kings 17: 17-21a, 22-24– 1st Reading)

A widow facing starvation heeds the Prophet Elijah's plea and shares with him her last provisions. He then moves in with her and her son and soon the boy grows ill and dies. In her grief, the woman claims that no good deed goes unpunished, or worse she fears the Prophet has come to expose her sins and bring God's punishment down upon her. Elijah is keenly aware of the woman's goodness to him and believes God led him to her door, so we can imagine him trying as hard as she to make sense of this calamity. His lips and arms are well ahead of his brain, and before he can find an answer he takes action.

All he seems to know is that he must bring the boy upstairs where he can plead openly with the Lord. He has no plan, no sudden revelation, but he has a relationship with God that's based on trust. God has led him before and so he trusts again. Then three times he stretches himself out upon the dead boy's body (this detail is left out of today's text) and begs the Lord to bring him back to life. Three times, not once, he makes this prayer before the boy is revived. Elijah's faith is tested, just like hers. When upon receiving her boy back, she confesses "indeed I know you are a man of God," she may be expressing the same awe that Elijah is feeling in the light of God's mercy.

Sometimes we take action without any clear expectation of being able to influence events for the better. We hear something beyond reason say, "Act." That ability to trust and to follow an instinct at the right time is a gift of the Spirit and usually the result of many years of intimate relationship with God. Elijah today is not a seer speaking for God, but a man of faith relying on God as years of prayer have trained him to do. Today, the difference between him and us is razor thin, for what he does is within the reach of all of us: in his fear and disorientation he knows where to run and what to say: "O Lord my Go, help me!"

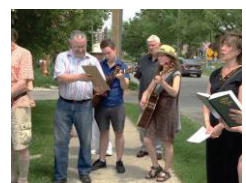
