For the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ:

“All the words that the Lord has spoken we will do” – the Israelites readily accepted the terms of the covenant centered on the Law that Moses received from God on the Mount Sinai.

For Israel, one of the central aspects of living the Law was the practice of offering sacrifice to God, including animal sacrifice, such as young bulls, as a “peace offering” and as a means of maintaining a covenantal relationship with God. Integral to animal sacrifice were the rituals associated with blood. The blood was carefully drained from the slain animal, some of the blood was “dashed against the altar” on which the animal was slain, and the rest was poured into large bowls and then sprinkled on the people. The animal’s blood on the people sanctified the Israelites, cleansing them spiritually and allowing them to be near God’s holy presence.

This ritual became known as “the blood of the covenant” and served to ratify the terms of the covenant between God and Israel. Following the Law, which often involved animal sacrifice, would become the foundational doctrine that defined Israel’s national identity.

The Letter to the Hebrews draws a sharp contrast between the “blood of goats and calves,” which was a Jewish ritual required to be repeated often and annually, and the blood of Christ, his “own blood,” that secured for believers once and for all time, “eternal redemption.”

In light of the Death and Resurrection of Christ, Jesus is the “mediator of a new covenant.” His Death on the Cross “redeems them from the transgressions” that separate us from God, so clearly defined in the “first covenant.” He is the new Passover Lamb. He feeds us with His own Body and Blood.

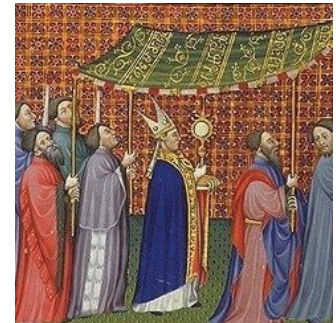

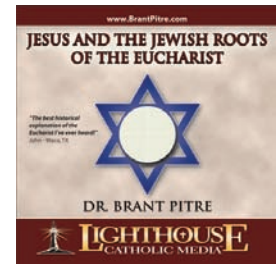
