



Registration is easy and can be completed at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Registration forms are available at the back of the Church.

**Sacramental Life -** St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending. If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

### Reflection on the First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9, 16-18. 25; 3:1-7

The book of Genesis begins with a poetic description of the origin of time and space brought about by God's Word. On the sixth day, God creates humanity in the divine image and gives them responsibility over the land and beasts. After this poetic account in which everything is good, the next chapters are about the origin of sin. The goodness of creation has become disordered.

Our reading today begins with Genesis' second view of human origins. First described as made in the divine image, the human being is now described in more earthy terms. God forms the man ('adam) out of clay of the ground ('adamah), and breathes life into him. From the same ground from which 'adam is formed, God makes various trees grow, with special mention of the tree of life and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. God's commands 'adam: "You may eat freely from any tree of the garden except from the tree of knowledge. The moment you eat from it you are surely doomed to die." Since none of the animals are suitable partners for the man and it is not good for 'adam to be alone, God creates a fitting helper. She is called Eve, from the word for "life," because she is mother of all the living.

The serpent enters the story that unfolds the origin of sin. The cunning serpent uses a shrewd question and deceitful answers to tempt the woman. We can see the movement from temptation, to sin, to consequences, and the underlying rationalization and motivations.

The serpent suggests how unreasonable God must be to deny the fruits of all the trees. The woman's response, as often happens when temptations are dangled, is not entirely truthful: God has forbidden even touching the tree, or face death. The serpent further tempts by, suggesting that God does not want humanity to be like gods; God is unfair! For Eve, the food of the tree now looks good, pleasing and desirable, illustrating how attractive sin can be to both the mind and senses. When 'adam also eats of the forbidden fruit, their eyes are opened; they have indeed gained knowledge of good and evil. Recognizing their nakedness, feeling shame and vulnerability, they clothe themselves, beginning to hide even from God. Yet even with the consequences of the couple's disobedience and hubris, the loving, forgiving God will remain ever present as the story continues. (Excerpt from Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word)

Lent has a penitential character. During Lent, penance is an important requirement of Christian life. Fulfilment of this duty involves prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial by fulfilling one's obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fast and abstinence.

The Church wants emphasis to be given to the evangelical law that a follower of Christ must do penance. While the heart of the penance is hatred for sin as an offence against God, external forms of penance are required to deepen and encourage the internal virtue.

Fridays are day of abstinence from meat, but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day. (The law of "abstinence from meat" binds those who are 14 and older.) Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and of abstinence from meat. The Pascal Fast, observed on Good Friday, where possible, should be continued through Holy Saturday.

Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save money to give to the poor. Fasting is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a means of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of depth of our faith. (The law of "fasting" binds those from 18 to 59 years of age.) (Excerpts from CCCB ORDO)


