For the Fourth Sunday of Lent ("A" Cycle of Readings):

God does not see as people see. The Pharisees of Jesus's day saw a sinner when they looked at the blind man. David's family saw only a young sheepherder where God saw a future king. The Story of David shows the power of God to raise up and to transform, to establish and to tear down. David becomes a living embodiment of one of the features of the Kingdom of God – "the last shall be first."

In the second reading today, Paul teaches us to move from "darkness" to "light". The message is clear and stark: once you were a child, but now you're an adult; once you were ignorant, but now you know; once you were without Christ, but now you have Him. And Paul's tone seems to add "So act like one! Be an adult, use your knowledge, live like a Christian." Paul admonishes to "take no part" in the "shameful" things done "secretly." Probably part of an early Christian hymn, "Sleeper, awake!" is a rousing call to action followed by the joyous promise that "Christ will shine on you."

In the Gospel, the disciples' question reflects the accepted wisdom that presumed that sin was the root cause of physical hardships like blindness. Jesus' response is surprising: "he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him." There is urgency in Jesus' actions — "night is coming when no one can work". The miraculous healing process and the beggar's response point to Jesus's identity — "the Light of the World."

Slimy mud formed from Jesus' saliva brings light into the blind man's darkness. Bringing light into the darkness, was God's first act of creation along with fashioning us from the slime of the earth. Jesus didn't use water to form the mud. If He had used water some might say that the miraculous power that gave the man sight came from water. Jesus used His own

saliva to demonstrate that the miraculous power giving sight to the man born blind came from Him and from Him alone.

The blind man's recognition of who Jesus really is came about gradually. First he told his neighbours that "the man called Jesus" made paste, put it on his eyes, and told him to go wash in the waters of Siloam. When questioned by the Pharisees who healed him the blind man said, "He is a prophet." Finally, Jesus searched him out and when He found the man he acknowledged that Jesus was the "Son of Man" and then worshipped Him, an act that one gives to God alone.
