Reflection on the Gospel: (John 4:5-2)

From the beginning to the end of John's Gospel he proclaims that Jesus comes to bring the fullness of life, life in God. John includes several accounts in which a person who engages with Jesus experiences growing insight into his identity, expressed in various titles. When understanding opens to believing in Jesus, the person is thereby impelled to bring others to encounter him. Through the words of a woman despised by Jews, John has proclaimed Jesus to be Jew, sir, Lord, Prophet, living Temple of God, truth, source of the living water, and Messiah.

The woman's word of witness to Jesus brings some of the townspeople to believe. The initial stage of faith consists in openness to truly experience Jesus, and the woman's neighbours already demonstrate such nascent belief. Faith must be active, a mutual indwelling in Jesus born of knowledge, insight, and ultimately love, that takes shape in active discipleship of witness. John uses the Greek word menó, "to stay, remain, abide," to indicate this loving union of the believer and Jesus. It is this term he uses for the townspeople invitation to Jesus to "stay" with them. As a result many people believed in Jesus "because of his word," — believing born of personal relationship.
