Reflection on the 2nd Reading (Philippians 2:6-11):

Some of the earliest Christian hymns are embedded in Paul's letters. In that new context, Paul adds to their original meaning, as seen in today's beautiful hymn. He introduces it by telling the Philippian community, "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus". Thus as the Hymn teaches about Christ, it also encourages believers to live the same way.

Central to the hymn is the proclamation that Christ emptied himself (*ekenosen*). The hymn is often entitled "The *Kenosis* Hymn." The first dimension of Jesus' kenosis is Incarnation (taking on the human likeness). The second dimension is taking on the form of a slave. His life was not privileged or powerful, but lowly (*kenosis* of humility). The third dimension is his obedience even to death on a Cross (*kenosis* of his self-emptying Death).

Because of Christ's total obedience in emptying himself, God exalted him. The second part of the hymn reverses the emptying motif. We can imagine the early Christians' exuberant singing at the verse "God highly exulted him"; the verb might be translated "superexalted," indicating the heights of glory after the depths of emptying. All the glory that Christ had forgone in his human form is now due to him by every person, in heaven and on earth.

Singing the hymn is already one way to confess that Christ is Lord – but there is more. Immediately after the hymn, Paul uses the word "therefore," reminding his audience that what they proclaim about Christ has implication for their own lives. The same obedience that characterized Christ' emptying should be evident in their own lives. The obedience they have already exhibited must continue. Without saying so explicitly, Paul implies that they too must empty themselves. Then he assures them that the God who superexalted Jesus "works in you both to desire and to work."
