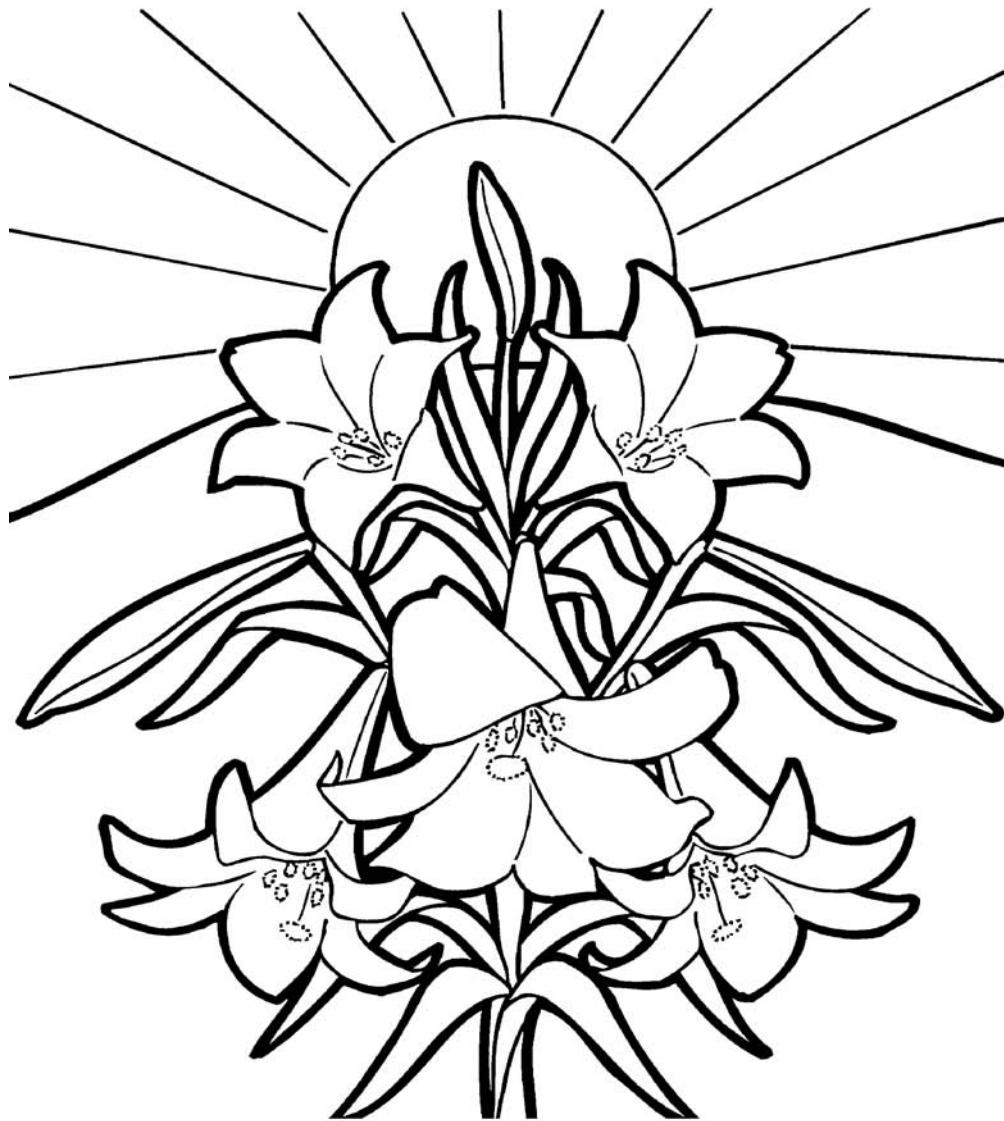

FOR EASTER SUNDAY:

In the Gospel reading for the Easter Vigil liturgy, Luke portrayed a skeptical Peter, who along with the rest of the Eleven dismissed the women's proclamation of the Resurrection. Peter ran to the tomb to see for himself. Finding only burial cloths, he was amazed, but Luke does not yet say that he believed. In Luke's second volume, Acts, Peter came to such depth of faith and conviction that despite opposition and persecution, he proclaimed Jesus as Messiah in numerous speeches to fellow Jews, beginning in Jerusalem, then throughout Judea and farther.

By the end of Luke's two-volume work, through the efforts of Peter and Paul and many co-workers, the Good News of Jesus Christ will have spread throughout the Gentile world. Thus unfolds the story of the early Church, in stages outlined by Luke at the beginning of Acts. Through the resurrected Christ, divine Spirit comes upon the disciples. In the power of this Spirit, they will serve as witnesses to Christ "in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth".

To what do these disciples bear witness? Peter begins his speech with reference to John the Baptist, the forerunner, and Jesus' earthly ministry. Jesus' proclamation by word and deed that God was beginning his final reign in Jesus' person and work is an important part of Peter's speech, for although Jesus was crucified, God raised him to a new life. In raising him from Death, God demonstrated the truth of Jesus'

message. Peter emphasizes to his hearers that they are receiving the word of witnesses to the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. They are witnesses in the dual sense of having firsthand experience of what they proclaim, and of giving public testimony to that experience. As Jesus was brought through Death to new Life, so these witnesses are transformed from fearful doubters to fearless witnesses to the Risen Christ.

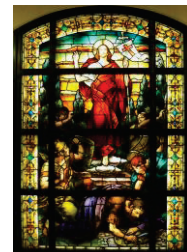
