

Reflection on the First Reading: Exodus 17:3 -7

The reading from Exodus unfolds after the people's departure from Egypt, but before the giving of the Law on Sinai. It portrays the chosen people complaining and requesting water in the wilderness. They are concerned that, by following God's servant Moses into the wilderness, they, their children, and their livestock will die of dehydration. Moses, for his part, worries that the complaints may lead to an uprising that will lead to his execution by stoning if the people decide to take justice into their own hands. Moses' concern is genuine for two reasons: the people's lack of water and lack of Law in the Sinai wilderness are both real. Strikingly, prior to providing them with the Law, the Lord quenches the people's thirst and does so by the very means with which they seemed to threaten Moses' life. To keep the people from striking Moses with rocks, God instructs Moses to strike the rock so that, through God's power, water might flow from it for the people.

Exodus conveys that Moses did as God commanded, and we are left to understand that the people's thirst was slaked. But the scene ominously closes with an account of how the place became associated with the people's quarrelling as they wondered whether or not the Lord was in their midst. Do we trust that the Lord is in our midst? (From Workbook for Lectors)

We continue to look at Biblical quotations corresponding to the text of the Mass: **General Intercessions:**

"We pray to the Lord." - Jeremiah 42:1-4: "Then all the military leaders, and all the people, from the least to the greatest, approached Jeremiah the prophet and said, 'Please grant our petition; pray for us to the Lord, your God, for all this remnant. As you see, only a few of us remain, but once we were many. May the Lord, your God, show us the way we should take and what we should do.' 'Very well!' Jeremiah the prophet answered them: 'I will pray to the Lord, your God, as you desire; whatever the Lord answers, I will tell you.'"

Acts 8:18-24: "When Simon (the magician) saw that the Spirit was conferred by the laying on of the apostles' hands, he offered them money and said, 'Give me this power too, so that anyone upon whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit.' But Peter said to him, 'May your money perish with you, because you thought that you could buy the gift of God with money. You have no share or lot in this matter, for your heart is not upright before God. Repent of this wickedness of yours and pray to the Lord that, if possible, your intention may be forgiven. For I see that you are filled with bitter gall and are in the bonds of iniquity.' Simon said in reply, 'Pray for me to the Lord, that nothing of what you have said may come upon me.'"

"Lord, hear our prayer." - 2 Kings 20:1-6: "In those days, when Hezekiah was mortally ill, the prophet Isaiah, son of Amoz, came and said to him: 'Thus says the Lord: Put your house in order, for you are about to die; you shall not recover.' He turned his face to the wall and prayed to the Lord: 'Ah, Lord, remember how faithfully and wholeheartedly I conducted myself in your presence, doing what was good in your sight!' And Hezekiah wept bitterly. Before Isaiah had left the central courtyard, the word of the Lord came to him: Go back and tell Hezekiah, the leader of my people: 'Thus says the Lord, the God of David your father: I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. Now I am healing you. On the third day you shall go up to the house of the Lord. I will add to your life fifteen years. I will rescue you and this city from the hand of the king of Assyria; I will be a shield to this city for my own sake and the sake of David my servant."
