

#### The First Reading from Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

In Luke's Gospel we heard of Jesus' healing of the ten lepers, with one being a Samaritan and the telling of the parable of the Good Samaritan. And in this Sunday's first reading we note a shift in the long-standing discord between the Samaritans and the Jews. In the Acts of the Apostles, we see Philip going to Samaria to preach to them about Christ. Philip was one of the seven chosen to assist the twelve Apostles in their ministry after the dispute broke out between the Hebrews and the Hellenists. Additionally, after the martyrdom of Stephen (one of the seven) and the persecution of the Church in Jerusalem, Philip and the other men were scattered, but continued to preach the Good News.

Philip goes to Samaria and God makes good use of these circumstances in which he finds himself. The crowds were mesmerized by what Philip was both saying and doing. They heard the Gospel and they were moved by the signs Philip performed, such as freeing people who were possessed and curing those who were paralyzed. The author of Acts notes that "there was great joy in that city."

The discovery of Philip's success by the Apostles in Jerusalem affirms the growth of the Church even more. They send Peter and John to impart the gift of the Holy Spirit to those newly baptized. While these people had been baptized in the Lord's name, Acts suggests that apostolic authority is necessary for the completion of baptism through the conferral of the Holy Spirit. Receiving the giving of the Holy Spirit from the Apostles underscores the importance of the Spirit's role in unifying the universal Church. For Luke, the authority of the Apostles and the unity of the Church are inseparable.
