

Pentecost is called the birthday of the Church. The interaction between the resurrected Lord and the small band of early disciples was the focus of the Easter season. With Jesus' Ascension into heaven, the small band was deprived of His physical presence, but assured that they would receive the gift of His Spirit, a gift that would inaugurate the next phase in salvation history. It is the birth of that next phase and the role of the Spirit that Pentecost commemorates.

With Jesus's Ascension, and with the choice of Matthias to bring the number back up to twelve, all is ready for the birth of the Church. This reading sets the context by mentioning that "the day of Pentecost had come." Although Pentecost began as an agricultural festival fifty days after Passover, Jews of Luke's time understood it as a covenant renewal ceremony celebrating the giving of Torah at Sinai.

Three physical phenomena describe the event: the sound of a driving wind, the appearance of tongues as of fire (seen only by those in the house), and the experience of spoken language. The parallels with the Sinai event (Ex 19:16-19) when God gave the Law are striking: God's theophany (appearance) in Exodus was marked by thunder, lightning/fire, clouds, a loud voice (noise), and wind and smoke. God's message was embodies in the voice and the fire. Thus in this "new Sinai" event at Pentecost, the disciples experience a theophany as they are filled with the Holy Spirit. The theophany is experienced also by the ingathering of Jews from all the nations speaking different languages. through the noise, but especially through the transformation of the disciples. The crowd does not need to see the flames, because they experience the Spirit infused disciples and their message, each in his own language. Jesus' earlier promise of the Spirit is fulfilled as the disciples speak of "God's deeds of power," and the Spirit gives birth to the Church. (From Workbook for Lectors)



The Advocate – The Holy Spirit bears many titles. For example, our Lord calls Him 'the Advocate'. Another translation has "Counsellor". Still others, "Consoler" or "Comforter"... In one of those happy but rare occasions, they are all acceptable translations...

As Advocate or Counselor, He pleads our case before the Judge. The ancient Greek word means a legal attorney or counsel. Yet unlike an advocate or counsellor in this world, the Holy Spirit does not stand beside us to defend our case. Rather, He dwells within us, as the soul of our souls. From within us He appeals to God. The Holy Spirit pleads our case in response to the devil, *the persecutor* who night and day accuses us before God (Rev. 12:10). The evil one tries to win our condemnation on the evidence of our sins. In response, the Holy Spirit stands as our Advocate. He wins our acquittal on the power of Christ's sacrifice, by which we have been redeemed and made children of God. He instructs us in the truth so that we can faithfully witness to Christ. He commands us what to say and, just as importantly, what not to....

Our Lord describes Christian witness in just this way: it is not you who will be speaking; the Spirit of your Father will be speaking in you (Mt 10:20). Most of all, the Holy Spirit is our Advocate in prayer. He prays from within us, bringing our prayers to our heavenly Father in His own voice. The Spirit Himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. (Rom 8:16). He comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit Himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words (Rom 8:26)...

The Holy Spirit is also the Spirit of truth (John 16:13). His comfort is greater than anything in this world because it is rooted in the truth. He does not bring a false mercy with being God's children. His words I will not leave you desolate (Jn 14:18) can be translated I will not leave you orphans. In the midst of the world's trials, the greatest comfort we have is that we are God's children. (By Fr. Paul Scalia from magnificat.net)
