For the Pentecost (First Reading):

Within the Judeo-Christian history and tradition, Pentecost celebrates two events. For ancient Israel, it commemorated the giving of the Law to Israel at Mount Sinai. For Jews, Pentecost was one of the central and defining moments in their history and in their relationship with God.

The Law was understood as a free gift given by God intended to make Israel a great and holy nation. It defined and separated Israel among the many other nations of the world.

For Christians, Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit onto the disciples, an event regarded as the birth of the early Church. As with the Mosaic Law, the presence of the Holy Spirit in the Church was a free gift, empowering the disciples to begin their mission: to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

In Acts, Luke records the descent of the Holy Spirit as fulfilling both the prophecy of John the Baptist and the promise of the resurrected Christ. Luke tells us the Holy Spirit descended from above and "rested" on each of the disciples, appearing to them, like "tongues, as of fire." Fire was not seen as a destructive force but rather as an element that symbolized transformation. As the "disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit," their very nature was changed. No longer frightened, they were now able to boldly proclaim the good news of the Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Christ on the streets of Jerusalem. They openly bore witness to "God's deeds of power" that they experienced in Jesus during His public ministry.

In Luke and Acts the Holy Spirit plays a leading role. In the opening chapters of the Gospel, the Holy Spirit "filled" Zechariah, Elizabeth, and Simeon, "overshadowed" Mary, resulting in the conception of Jesus, led Jesus into the wild to

be tempted by the devil, and remained present to Jesus in His ministry.

More so than any other Gospel writer, Luke is attentive to the workings of the Holy Spirit that were integral to the life of the early Christians.


