

In Thanksgiving for Graces Received – Estrada Family

The First Reading from Acts 2:1-11

On this feast of Pentecost, our first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles. The setting is the Jewish feast of Pentecost, also known as Shavuot. As Luke tell the story, Jesus' disciples and followers remained in the Jerusalem area after Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Because it was a pilgrimage feast, Jews from other parts of the world had also come to Jerusalem. On this particular day, Jesus' followers were gathered together in a house. Suddenly, they receive the Holy Spirit in the forms of a strong wind from the sky and tongues of fire that come down upon each of them. Wind and fire are signs of the theophany, a manifestation of the divine.

The New Testament associates a wide variety of gifts and abilities with the Holy Spirit, including speaking in tongues. When Jesus' followers in this story begin to speak to the crowd, the crowd is aware that each person hears them in their own language. Notice the crowd's reaction first to the sound coming from the house and later to the followers of Jesus speaking in tongues, but try not to get caught up in the drama. It is most important to observe that the Spirit moves Jesus' followers and uses them as his agents to preach "God's deeds of power," and they do so with great gusto!

- 1. Wisdom {Wisdom... understanding... intelligence: various names or aspects of the same gift} – a gift that God readily grants to all who ask in faith and that sustains the Christian in times of trial. It is a kind of knowledge or understanding not accessible to the unbeliever or those who doubt, which gives the recipients an understanding of the real importance of events. In this way a Christian can deal with adversity with great calm and hope.
- 2. Understanding This perfects our speculative reason and apprehension of the truth. Often times, people read scripture and don't understand it. You should read the Word of God only when you've first surrendered to the Spirit of God. If you have the Spirit of God inside you, scripture that was incomprehensible will become self-evident.
- 3. Knowledge This gift helps you know things you wouldn't already know. (Mat 16:13-17) - Jesus asks, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" Simon Peter said in reply. "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to vou, but my heavenly Father."
- 4. Counsel The gift of counsel is also called the gift of right judgement. Every step we take is a step closer to God, or a step closer to hell. When you have to make a decision, ask yourself if it will lead you closer to God, or away from God? Seek God's wisdom, take God's direction. Others will see you've surrendered your heart to God and seek your judgement and your counsel.
- 5. Fortitude Fortitude is courage. Standing up for what is right no matter what the consequences are, even to the point of death. In years past, many died for the faith. Today the faithful are ridiculed and targeted as fanatics. Are you willing to stand up for Christ even to the point of death? You need the courage of God. Do not condemn others though - stand for truth with love.
- 6. Piety Piety, or reverence means we come before God with humility so we can approach God more purely. If I live a life of piety, it means God's Spirit lives inside of me and people can see that. Ask, what would you have me today, Jesus? Do God's will in your daily life. When you have Piety you're no longer living life through your own power, but by the power of God.
- 7. Fear of the Lord Often misunderstood, fear of the Lord is not being frightened of God. It is awe of the God of the universe. "There is no fear in love, but perfect live drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment, and so one who fears is not yet perfect in love." - 1 John 4:18. We come to the Lord submissively, willing to do anything He wants and He gives us His gifts of the Holy Spirit.
