

### Reflection on the First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Today's readings focus on the consequences of the message of God's love for the growing community, as well as the expectations regarding attitudes and actions on the part of the individual believers.

The first reading is drawn from the story of the Gentile Cornelius. It is key for understanding an earth-shaking development in the community's notion of who is invited into the life of Christ and community of believers. Three scenes from Cornelius' story focus our attention on the message's transforming effect.

In the first scene, Peter enters Cornelius' home. Although not included in this reading, we know both Cornelius and Peter had earlier experienced impelling visions. Peter's vision had led him to understand that what God created must not be declared unclean. Cornelius, described as someone with devout faith in God, has a vision directing him to send for Peter, leading Cornelius and his family to welcome him. In the second scene, Peter now understands that being acceptable to God is not based on nationality or observing specific customs, but rather on fear of the Lord and righteousness of life. In the third scene, which follows Peter's preaching, the message consequences are revealed: the Holy Spirit descends on Cornelius and his household, leading them to speak in tongues and glorify God. Meanwhile, Peter's circumcised companions are amazed that God also chooses the Gentiles. All that remains is for the community to ratify God's decision ritually through the Sacrament of Baptism. (From Workbook for Lectors)

May God's love shine upon them and may the Holy Spirit be their constant guide as they embark on this sacred journey of faith.






