Reflection on the 2^{nd} reading (1 John 4:7-10):

BELOVED, LET US LOVE ONE ANOTHER, BECAUSE LOVE IS FROM GOD; EVERYONE WHO LOVES IS BORN OF GOD

AND KNOWS GOD.

This reading is one of the most beautiful New Testament poems. Aside from transmitting some theological insights, it draws those who hear it into an experience, specifically into a loving relationship with God. The word "love" is repeated in various forms, creating a rhythmic cadence and resonance, beginning with the opening address to the community as "beloved." Closely associated with love is another repetition: "God" (*theos*), the source and goal of life and love. The love that is of God is for us and revealed to us, and the divine initiative in loving us is the foundation of our love for one another.

The most personal way that God revealed love to us was by sending his Son into the world so that we might have life through him. The love of God and the life that God gives through Christ are both a present reality, and one still awaited in fullness. We have already been begotten by God, and we already know God. Having revealed love through the incarnation of his Son, God sent him "as expiation for our sins," referring to Christ's dying for our sins.

John's poetry is the vehicle for conveying the theology of Christ's Incarnation and Death; both are tangible signs of God's love for us. In John's well-crafted poem, even the prepositions draw us into the experience: the love of God for us, revealed to us, and coming thought Christ. God's love is not static, but forceful and dynamic, and the movement of the poetry is dynamic as well.






