Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending.

If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date.

A marriage preparation course is required.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

For the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Eschatology, the study of the end times, is an important concern of the final weeks of the liturgical year. It's appropriate that as we approach the end of the year, we contemplate the end of time in order to remind ourselves that Christ will, in fact, return and no one knows when that day will be. One of Satan's best tricks, C. S. Lewis wrote, is to convince us that we have plenty of time. Only God knows how much time we actually have; therefore, vigilance is a hallmark of Christian living.

Malacchi's words are meant to trouble the comfortable who have grown lax and disillusioned. After the exile and the rebuilding of the Temple, the people have become lukewarm in their faith. Danger threatens from without and yet the people don't place their trust in God. So the Prophet sounds the alarm to warn the people that the day of the Lord, fierce and "burning like an oven" will reduce evildoers to "stubble." Stories and film that depict the end in apocalyptic terms take their lead from this text. It's meant to rouse and it does the job well.

Throughout His ministry, Jesus repeated that His Kingdom was not of this earth. Though he was concerned about the day to day life of his followers and for the kind of discipleship one had to embrace to enter God's Kingdom, Jesus never stopped directing focus to an eschatological future whose advent even he was not priviledged to know.

Whenever the end may come, it is undeniable that each day draws us closer. Just as illness and handicaps in our younger years help us anticipate old age and life's end, so too, wars, natural disasters and great signs in the sky help us anticipate the day when the life of the planet will cease and all existence will be forever transformed. Jesus is drawn into discussing the end after gazing on the Temple and anticipating its imminent demise. Such awareness is healthy and necessary for all mature believers.
