Reflection on the First Reading: Proverbs 31:10-13, 16-18, 20, 26, 28-31++

The reading from Proverbs is part of the instruction given to King Lemuel by his mother. She warns him about the pitfalls of strong drink, then reminds him to care for the poor, and be a champion of the needy. After she cautions him about wasting his strength (hayil) on women, she describes the kind of woman he should seek: a woman of strength (hayil), translated in our reading as "capable." Strength, often associated with physical or military competence, has a much broader meaning, including social, political, practical, and intellectual dimensions. Most importantly, like the king himself, his wife should be characterized by a strength that encompasses virtuous living and wisdom.

The poem is organized by the letters of the Hebrew alphabet, with each verse beginning with a consecutive letter, opening with the first (aleph) and concluding with the last (tav). Like similar structures found in the Psalms, this acrostic pattern is orderly and complete, presenting the perfect wife as a paragon of goodness worth more than rubies. To such a woman, a man entrusts his heart. Long recognized as a symbol of love, the heart (leb) indicates a person's innermost being, the capacities of mind and will and emotion, referring to a person in totality. The couple is thus united at the deepest level.

The worthy, strong wife exercises her skills both in the household and in the broader society. Obtaining wool and flax and plying the spindle were signs of an accomplished woman,

one who would take responsibility for maintaining the home. Yet, like her husband, she looks beyond the home, reaching out to the poor and needy. The poem presents a picture of king and queen united for the benefit of the kingdom. Accomplished as she is, the greatest praise that the worthy wife receives is that she fears the Lord. She stands in reverent awe before the God who governs all things.

Though the advice is given to a king, the portrait of the strong, ideal woman has been applied to worthy wives in general. The text is traditionally recited by Jewish men to their wives on Sabbath evenings, and is often part of funeral services for women.
