For Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe:

Today, the Church again invokes the Old Testament's apocalyptic expectation of a messianic figure called the Son of Man. The First Reading envisions the final intervention of God in human history, acting through the anointed one or messiah. In the last several centuries BC, Judaism thought of the messiah as a function rather than as a particular figure. There were a number of different expectations about how the anointed of the Lord would appear. The role of messiah was singular: to act as God's agent in bringing about the final age of salvation in which God would rule over all things. One such messianic figure was son of man. The phrase originally meant "human being," but in several apocalyptic works, it came to refer to a messianic figure, who would do God's bidding on earth as a human being, and then be raised to the heavenly level, implying some kind of divinity. God's final reign over all things, and often the final judgement, would be carried out through the messianic son of man.

In today's reading from the Book of Daniel, the son of man having accomplished his task as the anointed one, is raised to the throne of God (the "One who is Ancient of Days") and begins his final, definitive reign through the exalted messiah.

Today's Second Reading from Revelations opens by introducing a vision of the crucified, now resurrected Christ, the Messiah who has begun God's age of salvation. Since the author wrote for Christians facing persecution and perhaps even death for refusal to worship the Roman Emperor as divine, it is important to introduce Jesus as "firstborn of the dead" who exerts power over all human rulers. The resurrected Christ as first born implies siblings – daughters and sons of God who, though they might suffer death as Jesus did, will be raised through faith in him. Such brothers and sisters of Jesus

form his Kingdom, where the power of God rules through him, conquering the enemies of sin and death.

In Greek, alpha and omega are the first and the last letters of the alphabet. The focus of Jesus' passage through death to greater, everlasting life reveals the ultimate ruling power of God at work. It is this life-giving power now acting through Christ that holds sway over all things forever.
