Reflection on the First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17

The God who speaks to Ezekiel announces both comfort and judgement. In the verses just before today's reading, God tells Ezekiel to prophesy against the shepherds, or leaders, of Israel, particularly the kings who have responsibility for the flock. Because they have not cared for their subjects, God declares, "Ah, you shepherds of Israel who have been feeding vourselves!" God says that his flock has become food for the wild beasts because their shepherds looked out only for themselves.

Concerned for these abandoned sheep, God promises to become their shepherd, saying, "I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out." Unlike the lax and self-centered leaders of Israel, God's shepherding will be energetic and attentive. God will search and seek out; both verbs indicate active searching, necessary because so many sheep have been scattered due to the neglect of kingly shepherds. God will rescue these scattered sheep; here God's action is forceful, snatching them away from predators. The flock belongs to God, who refers to them as "my sheep," the sheep are God's own, and God takes on all the responsibility for them: pasturing (feeding), giving them rest (letting them lie down). God announces that the lost, strayed, injured, and sick will receive special attention.

After describing God's compassionate shepherding, the prophecy returns briefly to the condemnation of those who grow sleek and strong while ignoring their flock. God will shepherd them rightly, literally, "will feed my sheep with justice." Hearing this reading on the last Sunday in the liturgical year, we look ahead to God's final accounting of all the flock, from the lost to the leaders. It is reassuring that the God who will judge is the same God who is the benevolent shepherd, the one to whom the flock belongs.


