For First Sunday of Advent:

The new liturgical year begins as the last one ended, with visions of cosmic events that presage the end of time. The sobering nature of today's Gospel advances Advent's less recognized purpose – to expand our focus from Jesus' first coming as a child and remind us he will return on a cloud and will be clothed in glory. The two figures of Advent – the babe of Bethlehem and the Son of Man – are but one person: the eternal Christ who judges us and sends us to the eternal destiny we've chosen through the way we've lived our lives. The choices are "dissipation ... and worries of this life" or the Gospel.

This will not be anyone's favourite Advent reading. Neither should it be seen as incongruous text mistakenly placed within a season of joy and hope, because hope is at its centre. While the end can be terrifying, it need not be for those who have persevered in faith. They can "stand up and raise their heads" because what awaits them is "redemption." And it's the birth of redemption that we celebrate at Christmas. Christianity always holds opposing truths in tension, never compromising one for the sake of the other. Both must be acknowledged and honoured. In Advent we can hear both the lullabies of Bethlehem and the foreboding storm, that rages in this Gospel.

The reason we listen for the storm is that it will come unexpectedly. Even for the faithful the end times will be hard, hence we must pray for "strength" – not to endure, but to "escape" the hardships of that day. While pointing to that final time, Advent also reminds us that each day we greet the sun might be the last before we stand before the "Son of Man."
