Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending.

If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date. A marriage preparation course is required.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

Reflection on the First Reading (Wisdom 7:7-11)

The model sage, Solomon, did not receive wisdom as a birthright. He requested it in his inaugural prayer as sovereign, desiring wisdom above all other goods: sceptres and thrones, material wealth, health, and beauty, and even sunlight. Wisdom is the evidence of God's personal involvement in the created world. More than a blueprint, it is God's saving presence. Because Solomon requested wisdom over the customary perks of royal office, God added to this gift everything Solomon had not requested. In this we hear an echo of Jesus urging us to seek first the Kingdom of God and God's righteousness, and all other good things will be given besides.

Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14). We know few other facts about Luke's life from Scripture and from early Church historians. Luke was born a Greek (at Antioch in Syria) and a Gentile. Luke's gospel shows special sensitivity to evangelizing Gentiles. It is only in his gospel that we hear the parable of the Good Samaritan, that we hear Jesus praising the faith of Gentiles such as the widow of Zarephath and Naaman the Syrian, and that we hear the story of the one grateful leper who is a Samaritan. The scholars have argued that Luke might have been born a slave. It was not uncommon for families to educate slaves in medicine so that they would have a resident family physician.

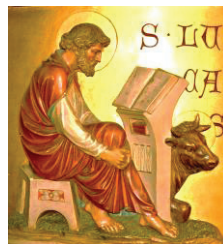

We know nothing about Luke's conversion, but looking at the language of Acts we can see where he joined St. Paul (Acts 16:8-9). It was at Troas at about the year 51 AD. Luke accompanied Paul into Macedonia (Samothrace, Neapolis, and Philippi). Luke stayed behind at Philippi and re-joined Paul in Troas in 58 AD. Luke was the loyal comrade who stayed with Paul during his imprisonment in Rome about the year 61 AD.

Luke's unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other gospels. Luke's is the gospel of the poor and of women. He is the one who tells the story of Lazarus and the Rich Man, the story of the Annunciation (and Magnificat), Mary's visit to Elizabeth, the Presentation, and the story of Jesus' disappearance in Jerusalem.

Forgiveness and God's mercy to sinners is also of first importance to Luke. Only in Luke's gospel do we hear the story of the Prodigal Son, the story of the forgiven woman disrupting the feast by washing Jesus' feet with her tears. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner who wants to return to God's mercy.



The earliest tradition we have says that Luke died at 84 AD in Boeotia after settling in Greece to write his Gospel.

He is patron saint of doctors, surgeons and painters. He is often shown with an ox because these are the symbols of sacrifice - the sacrifice Jesus made for all the world. *Based on article from Catholic Online (catholic.org)*
