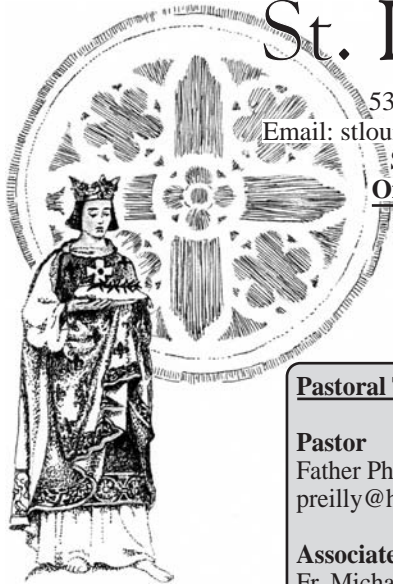

For the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time (2nd Reading):

Among several major emphases, Letter to the Hebrews portrays Jesus Christ as the true and final High Priest. In Judaism, the high priest alone could enter the Holy of Holies in the Temple, the physical place where God was thought to dwell among the covenant people. The high priest did so once a year, on the Day of Atonement, to make an offering for the sins of the entire people. He thus represents the one who serves the most pivotal role as intermediary between God and the people. The author interprets Jesus as Son of God and the great High Priest who has been raised to the fullness of God's presence, there to atone fully for all.

But in the very next sentence, the author who has just affirmed Jesus as Son of God also underscores his full humanity. Jesus is not a High Priest who places himself above or apart from his people. But one who has shared in human suffering and weakness, tried and tested like every human being – yet he did not sin. With such a high priest, believers can also approach God, confident in an intermediary who is himself both divine and human.
