Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending.

If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

October 2019 - Extraordinary Missionary Month "Baptized and Sent" called by Pope Francis on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of Pope Benedict XV Apostolic Letter *Maximum Illud* to give new impetus to the missionary task of proclaiming the Gospel.



In the 17th century Europe the Spirit of the Lord created an astonishing mystical renewal that raised a missionary zeal for the Christianization and salvation of peoples. In France, in particular, the religious order of the Society of Jesus was interested in the Aboriginal populations of New France. The Jesuits settled and led their mission. This

effervescent evangelical movement became the most famous spiritual and heroic saga of Canada’s history. Among the group that was sent out eight men in particular stood out because of their deep life of prayer and contemplation, their brave apostolic zeal to the extent of giving their life out of love for Christ. Jean de Brébeuf, Antonie Daniel, Gabriel Lalment, Charles Garnier and Noël Chabanel endured martyrdom in the region of Midland, Ontario; Issac Jogues as well as two lay collaborators, René Goupil and Jean de La Lande died on the current territory of the US, in the region of Auriesville, NY. The eight men were killed during the war between the Hurons and the Iroquois. Some of them, like Jean de Brébeuf, in a particular atrocious way. The Iroquois wanted to eradicate the Huron nation. Their purpose was also to eliminate the missionaries, because they participated as allies to the Hurons in resisting the invasions. However, before dying and receiving the crown of glorious martyrdom, the missionaries gained the majority of the Huron nation to a radical Christian faith. In return, the Hurons propagated this faith after their dispersal, for the greater glory of God.

These great heralds of the Gospels not only laid the foundations of the Canadian Church, but they distinguished themselves as avant-garde models of “inculturation”. For example, they adopted the living and eating style of the Aboriginals, they patiently mastered their language, going as far as to compose a dictionary and a grammar, and they even used musical art as a means of evangelization. Moreover, the Christmas song “Jesous Ahatonhia” (Jesus is born), written by Jean de Brébeuf in the vernacular language, turns out to be the oldest Christmas carol widespread in Canada.

In 1930, Pope Pius XI canonized the eight renowned missionaries and thereafter, Pope Pius XII declared them, “Holy Canadian Martyrs, secondary patrons of Canada.”

Holy Canadian Martyrs, your lives bore witness of a great affection of Christ, Mary and the Church. You heard the call and were sent out to proclaim the Gospel to the Aboriginals of America. You are an inspiring model for the evangelization of cultures; intercede for us and support the Church in mission throughout the world!

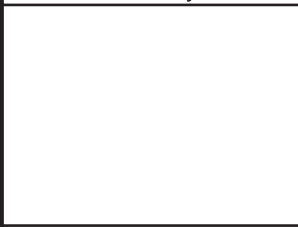
