Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending. If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

Reflection on the Second Reading (Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a)

The reading from Hebrews depicts two vivid and varied scenes embracing the past and present, earth and heaven, human and divine, with dramatic sights and sounds, and emotions ranging from dread to festivity. The first part of the reading reminds the audience of an event long past that took place on Mount Sinai, the place where God made covenant with Israel. There God’s presence was experienced in the vision of fire, in darkness and storm, and in the sound of a trumpet blast and a voice so fearful that the audience begged not to hear any further message. The people did not approach the awesome God of Mount Sinai, and they pleaded with Moses, “Let not God speak to us, or we shall die” (Exodus 20:19).

But now, says the author of Hebrews, you have approached another mountain, Mount Zion, which is both an earthly and a heavenly dwelling of the living God. The fear and inability to approach the awesome God of Sinai if transformed into a festal gathering and approachability of Mount Zion. Moses is the mediator at Sinai, and now Jesus is the mediator of the new covenant. Some of the faithful, “the firstborn enrolled in heaven,” along with “the spirits of the just” have already transcended the earthly Zion in Jerusalem to the heavenly, eternal Zion. Accompanying these faithful people are countless Angels, heavenly beings who were thought to be hovering over Mount Zion.

Children and Youth Programs starting this fall:

-All **Sunday children's programs** will resume on September 8th during the 9:30am Mass. **We are in need of one volunteer for Liturgy of the Word.** The leader whom I need to pair you up with is open to someone who would like to co-lead or with someone who would like to just be the supportive extra adult in the room.

-**Confirmation** – If you are in grade 7 and would like to do your sacrament here at St. Louis parish, classes will take place every Wednesday, beginning September 25, 7pm-8:30pm in the nursery. Confirmation will take place on December 1 at 2pm.

- **Good Shepherd Program** – is for children ages 3-10 yrs of age. There are three levels/classes that are based on the Bible and on the Liturgy of the church. Your child will learn how to ponder and think about what Jesus is telling each of us in parables, why Fr. Phil does many of the gestures during Mass, why we say the prayers that we say, etc. This is all done through guided activities. Each child is given the opportunity to fall in love with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in a child friendly space we call the Atrium. Our teaching methods are Montessori based, this allows the child to set the pace and to ponder as long as they like on the wonders and mysteries of our faith. All three levels will run Mondays from 4pm-5:30pm.

- **Youth Group** – Anyone in gr. 6-gr. 12 are welcome to join us on Friday evenings from 7pm-9pm. We have a great group of young people who get together twice a month. Some meetings are full of fun and games, some meetings are to learn more about our faith. We do go on some field trips. If you would like to connect with young people of the parish come and join us.

- **Youth Music** – If you are a youth of the parish and have some musical talent that you would like to share please come out and join us. We get together three Friday's of the month from 6pm-7pm, the 4th week we lead the music at the 5pm Mass. Practices begin Sept. 6th We are in need of more youth!!
