**Anointing and Pastoral Care:** Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for Sacrament of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, or Sacrament of the Sick.

**Pastoral Care to those in Hospital:** Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

**For the 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:**

This week in the Gospel we hear a parable which is unique to the Gospel of Matthew. It is a story about the nature of the Kingdom of God in which the main character is an enigmatic “owner” whose behaviour, at least in the eyes of his workers, is eccentric at best.

The owners behaviour could not be less like the expected behaviour of even the fairest contemporary employer. Our expectations are a fair day’s pay for a fair day’s work. Parity is the guide.

But Jesus is not offering guidelines for labour arbitration. He is making a point about the abundance of the Kingdom. “Fair” is a wholly different meaning here determined not by our small and petty notions, but by God’s inscrutable wisdom. Everyone can get a full day’s pay because payment is not earned but awarded in the Kingdom, and God can be as generous as He wants.

While living in the world, in the “not yet” Kingdom, adopting Kingdom values will make us “first” in the eyes of God but may make us “last” in human ranking. Success and reward cannot be the motivation for serving Christ. In the reordered value system of the Kingdom, the “first” who serve Christ shall be the “last” in the eyes of the world. But in the end, the first who become last will be the last who become first. For it will be God who distributes rewards and God is sovereign Lord, lavishing gifts on whomever He wills.

**Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: Why is there such a collection? (September 27 and 28, 2014).**

Every year, the Bishops of Canada make an appeal for financial assistance to support their work and the work of each diocese by means of the Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada. The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), the Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau, has described this Collection as “an opportunity for all the faithful in our country to give a hand to helping the Gospel!” The annual Collection allows each diocese to meet its financial obligations to the regional episcopal assemblies and to the national episcopal Conference. “Any additional revenues raised help the diocese support its own diocesan pastoral programs and other activities,” Archbishop Durocher explains. The CCCB is the national assembly of the Catholic Bishops in Canada, and includes the Bishops of the Eastern Catholic Churches.


