For the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In today's second reading Paul spares no effort in pleading the cause of unified love. He scolds, nags, prods, loves and teaches: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others."

What follows is the text proclaimed every year on Palm Sunday. It traces the trajectory of Christ's eternal existence from before the incarnation when He enjoyed equality with God; through His incarnation when He willingly surrendered that status to become human in all things but sin and accepted even Death on the Cross; to His exaltation by God and His establishment as eternal Lord over heaven and earth.

Though the hymn first lauds Christ for humbling Himself to become human, it is Paul's mention of the Cross that is important. The pattern of life of Christ must also be ours: the path to exaltation runs through the Cross because God's kingdom is a place of reversals where emptying leads to filling and humility to glorification.

Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: An Act of Solidarity!

To help continue the mission of faith and evangelization, the Bishops of Canada gather in four regional assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West), and also in a national Conference (the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops). The CCCB is particularly mandated by the Holy See and the Bishops of Canada to assist dioceses and their Bishops in a number of areas of pastoral life: faith formation, doctrine, ecumenical dialogues, international relations, interreligious conversations, liturgy, relations with Indigenous Peoples, social justice, and building a culture of life and family. In his letter to the parishes across the country in which he explains the Collection, CCCB President Archbishop Paul-André Durocher of Gatineau recalls that Pope Francis proclaimed two of the founders of the Church in Canada saints of the Universal Church: Bishop François de Laval and Mother Marie of the Incarnation. "By contributing to the Collection, you collaborate with us in our ministry and in following the steps of Saint François de Laval and Saint Marie of the Incarnation who also gave a hand to helping the Gospel," the CCCB President writes.


