Sunday programs for children - During the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Mass there is babysitting for children under 3 years of age, Sunday School for 3 to 6 years of age and Children's Liturgy of the Word for children ages 7 and up.

Sacramental Life - St. Louis Parish celebrates the sacraments for its members who are registered and regularly attending. If you are not registered you are automatically a member of a parish closest to you.

Baptism - Celebrated once a month. Please speak with a priest after Mass on Sunday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - Saturdays 4 - 4:30 p.m., or by appointment.

Marriage - For registered and attending members, please contact the parish office at least one year in advance of your date.

Becoming Catholic - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, preparing adults for baptism and/or to join the community. Please contact the office for further information.

Anointing and Pastoral Care - Our parish community cares about the sick and elderly and the lonely. Please notify the parish office to arrange for them to receive the Anointing of the Sick, or to have the Holy Communion brought to them.

Pastoral Care to those in Hospital - A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit. Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital.

Reflection on the Second Reading (1 Timothy 6:11-16)

Paul begins his exhortation to Timothy by addressing him as “man of God.” The designation, used of Hebrew Prophets, indicates that Paul sees Timothy as one chosen by God who will carry on Paul’s prophetic role as a leader in the faith. In today’s reading, Paul gives Timothy a final instruction; he doesn’t delineate specific tasks for Timothy to perform, but presents to him a way of life that flows from his baptism. Paul begins with a list of virtues that Timothy should pursue, implying energetic dedication to living as Jesus did: in righteousness, godliness, and the other virtues manifest in Jesus.

The energy of pursuing virtue is also needed for Timothy to fight the good fight well for the faith. Like an athlete striving to win the prize, Timothy is to strain forward toward the finish line. Because eternal life is a gift already possessed as a down payment, Timothy can lay hold of it even now as he runs toward the completion of the race and the fullness of eternal life.

At baptism, Timothy had made a good confession, or profession of faith. The faith that Timothy processes, like that of everyone in the Church, includes adherence to the teaching handed down, the pursuit of virtue, and keeping of commandments. Having exhorted Timothy to virtue and faith, Paul turns his focus to Christ in a poetic text that may have been part of a baptismal profession of faith. This rich proclamation about Christ, King of Kings and Lord of Lords, moves naturally to prayer, concluding with a faith-filled “Amen!”

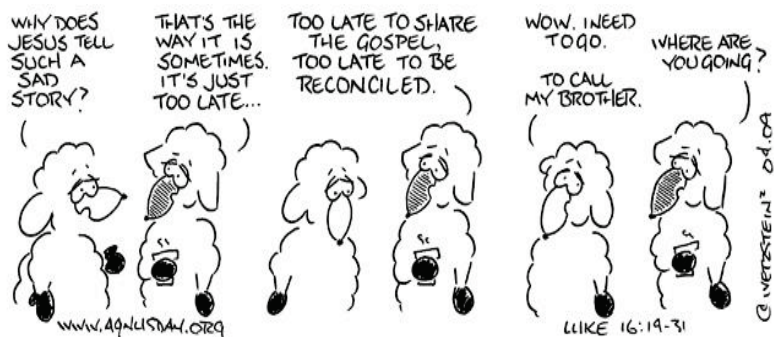
