


For the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time:

The first reading carries as serious and sobering message, especially for anyone who exercises the care of souls. It points to the gravity of undertaking ministry in the name of the Lord. Ezekiel proclaims a message that echoes throughout the Hebrew scriptures: with election comes responsibility. Ezekiel conveys this message with the image of a "watchman" whose task it was to stand on the hilltop watching for approaching danger and give warning when aggressors approached. In like manner, the prophet must recognize and warn of the dangers that lurk in the hearts and actions of the people of Israel. Divine warning must be delivered undiluted, God says, no matter how unpopular they are. Speak what must be spoken and you will live. Those who ignore you are responsible for their own fate.

In the Gospel, clear directions are given for handling correction among the community of believers. Rather than warning of dire consequences, Jesus endorses repeated efforts to win over a recalcitrant sister or brother. The approach is immensely practical as well as inspired: try to work it out and if that fails, get help When that, too, is unsuccessful, take it to the higher authority. Each step is intended to resolve the problem with the least amount of effort and disruption to the community. But when "even....the Church" is ignored, the believer is categorized with those who are least acceptable within the Jewish community – the "Gentiles" and "tax collector". For such cases power to bind and loose is conferred on the entire church community. Jesus guarantees God's answer to our prayers because even where only "two or three" are gathered, Christ is fully present.
