

A Word From Our Pastor:

A place which I have always wanted to visit is the Trappist Monastery in Gethsemane, Kentucky. It is a place where people can make retreats throughout the year. One priest in our Diocese often goes there for retreats. He has told me on a number of occasions that it is his favourite location to attend for retreats.

Some of you may recognize the name of the monastery and its most famous resident. This is the place where Father Thomas Merton call home for many years. Father Thomas was one of the greatest Catholic voices of the 20th Century through the numerous books that he wrote and the lectures which he gave. A number of his books were requirements to read when I attended the seminary. Throughout his writings, Father Merton was honest in his thoughts on his struggles to live a proper faith life. On numerous occasions he contemplated leaving the monastic life and returning to the secular world. To read his writings, one realizes that we are not the only ones who may struggle in our relationship with God.

One time, while giving a lecture to the abbey novices, Father Thomas described to them what the word abide means. It is a word which Jesus uses in our Gospel this Sunday.

Father Thomas said: "It's like you are trying to catch a plane. You are late. You hop in your car and speed to the airport. Every delay gives you ulcers. You reach the parking lot; grab you stuff and race down the corridor to get to the right gate. You rush onto the plane, flop down in your seat, and give a sigh of relief. You made it. In one sense you have made your destination. Then the plane takes off and you are on your way to other places, going higher and faster than ever before, but now you are not frantic or worried. That's what it means to be in Christ."

In our Gospel passage, Jesus speaks of remaining in Him and allowing His word to remain in us. We may not read one of Father Thomas' books, even though they will help us in many ways, still, we must remember that to abide in someone or to abide somewhere is to live permanently somewhere. It is to hold out in that place no matter what.

As we come closer to Pentecost Sunday, we are called to not allow ourselves to grow too far away from the true vine, which is Christ. The farther away we are, the less quality fruit we produce. If we get too far from the vine, we produce nothing of lasting value.

Just as Father Merton taught the young novices, Jesus is telling us that once we are in Him, we are practically at our spiritual destination. There is still a journey to take and will have hard moments, but Jesus encourages us to remain on the journey. We are called to abide with Him.
