

## A Word From Our Pastor:

want to take this opportunity to wish all of you and your families a very blessed Easter. As your Pastor it is a great joy to celebrate the Easter Triduum with you. We must always remember that it is the central mystery of our redemption.

Easter calls us to celebrate the fact that the Light of Christ has come into the darkness of our world providing us with hope for a future greater than we dare believe. It is a reminder that Christ's victory at Easter broke all the chains of sin we have ever made for ourselves.

Many will see this day as one of joy and celebration, however, another message we need to believe is not to fear on this day. Yes, something may make us feel afraid, but we don't have to live in fear. We are afraid that a loved one has a serious illness which leads to them dying, but we do not have to fear their death. A lack of fear does not mean a lack of worry. We will still worry about a job or the economy, and we will worry about our children. We will have worries about the future, or we might be afraid to walk on a dark street at night. Yes, there are many things which worry us, but we do not have to live in fear.

This is the state of life given to us by Christ through His Resurrection. The Apostles and others like Mary Magdalen were not fully prepared for the Resurrection, even though Jesus had provided to them hints about His death and Resurrection. What they eventually learned to believe was that they would face their fear because their faith led to conviction, and their conviction was the foundation of courage.

For us, Easter has no meaning if Christ has risen from His tomb, and we are afraid to come forth and put the darkness of sin to flight by exposing ourselves to His light. We must come to see that all our hopes and happiness come through Christ's Resurrection. It announces that love is present in the world and is more powerful than the evil any individual may carry out. On this Easter Sunday let us not be afraid to proclaim Christ's Resurrection. It is through our union with Christ in Baptism that we share in the glory of His Resurrection. Baptism means letting the Word of God dwell in our hearts by doing everything in our lives in the name of Jesus Christ.
