

A Word From Our Pastor:

e read from the fourth week of five of the 'Bread of Life' discourse from the Gospel of John this Sunday.

Some of us may remember back in the mid 1990's when the letters WWJD were popular among Catholics and Christian groups. The letters represent the term "What would Jesus Do?" You would see these letters or words on numerous items. Bracelets and other forms of jewelry were popular with this inscription. There were t-shirts which one could buy as well. In one of my first appointments as a priest, I can remember having a parishioner give me a book with this inscription in its title as a Christmas gift. I thought that I still had this book in my collection, however, I could not locate it this past week.

Some would be critical of this advertising of our Lord's name. Many would say that it was just a money-making endeavor for many people. However, if one were serious on this matter, they would come to the realization that this question is at the heart of Catholic faith and wisdom.

"Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you." These words spoken by Jesus caused much consternation in Jesus' listeners, but not for obvious reasons. The word John uses for eating was 'trogein' which is Greek in its origin. This verb refers to the crunching sounds that we make when we eat, but in the world at the time of Christ, the idea of eating something of a god was not unusual. It was referred to often.

When an animal was sacrificed, such as a lamb at Passover, the people would eat the sacrifice. The belief was that you took on the attributes of the thing offered to God and eaten. A lamb was both pure and innocent and it was a gift to God. It was a religious act of partaking in the life of God to eat the lamb.

However, the Jewish people were forbidden to drink the blood of animals. Blood was seen as the symbol of life. For Jesus to suggest His blood was lifegiving was for them scandalous. Only God gave life. His urging of the people to drink His blood and saying that it gave life caused some who were following Him to reject Jesus and express how hard these words were to accept.

The Gospel of John uses the words of the early eucharistic meal to make its point. Jesus is the

revelation of God, and if we are to know God, we must know who Jesus is. We learn this best in the Eucharist, wherein we eat His flesh and drink His blood. He is now the one to be consumed and absorbed.

The question of "What would Jesus do?' is still one that we need to ponder. We must come to the altar week after week and in very real and practical ways, begin making all our decisions based on this question.
