

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e are coming to the end of summer. Many of us will be disappointed because the weather has been great this year and we have had the opportunities to travel more often and more freely than the previous two summers. People are getting out more often now. I could not help but notice that when I was walking through the Leathertown Festival this past Sunday. It was great seeing everybody out enjoying themselves and the weather was great as well.

Many will be going on journeys at the end of this month or the beginning of September. I am specifically talking about young people going to new schools for studies especially those going to College or University for the first time. These are exciting times for many. Yes, a little nervousness, but still a time of anticipation.

I guess you can say that all of us are on a journey. We should see it as being one which is spiritual. Yes, our life journey is full of doubts, difficulties, and tensions. Still, if we are open to the possibility that heaven is at the end of this journey of ours, then we can overcome anything that may challenge us. We must never take salvation for granted. It is offered to all, but it is not given freely.

In this Sunday's Gospel, when Jesus is asked "how many will be saved?", He does not provide an answer. Rather, He leaves it in the hands of His Eternal Father. It is the wrong question to be asked. The question which should be asked is: "how does one attain salvation?" Jesus is warning us against having an over-confident or presumptuous attitude. We cannot sit back and take salvation for granted, expecting God to do everything for us. Entrance to heaven is not easy. If we want to make this journey, we cannot afford to be complacent. We need to 'strive' as Jesus says in the Gospel.

How can we achieve this? By developing a friendship with God and His Son. Friendship with the Lord is the proper response to God's invitation to join Him in the Kingdom. Friendships require work, as we are shown in our relationships here on earth. It is the same with heaven and with God. Acquaintances are not friendships. Many will desire a casual relationship with God, Jesus warns us that it must take a far greater effort to reach heaven.

We need to pray that is our relationship with God truly becomes important enough for us to work on it in a serious manner, that we will, in fact, have enough time to make a difference.


