

A Word From Our Pastor:

here is a cute story which is very appropriate for this Third Sunday of Advent. During a religious educations class, a teacher asked the students why there was a rose candle in the Advent wreath, while the others were purple. A little girl put up her hand and asked, "Perhaps Joseph and Mary were hoping that it would be a girl?"

All joking aside: Why is there a rose candle? Many will see Advent as being a time of joy and anticipation at the birth of Our Lord. Years go this was not the case. Advent was seen as a time of serious preparation. It was not quite as penitential a season as Lent, but going to confession and engaging in serious spiritual preparation was the norm. Christmas decorations did not go up early but rather just a couple of days before Christmas. The first Mass of the Christmas liturgy was celebrated at Midnight and not before. Even the Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" comes from the time when Christmas celebrations began on Christmas and continued until the Epiphany and beyond.

The rose candle is a sign that today is Gaudete Sunday, which reminds us that we are halfway through the Season of Advent and that the time of preparations is nearly over. We can allow a little bit of celebration on this Sunday to give us the patience we need to last this through this final period of waiting.

The question which we need to ponder on this day is whether we still need this particular Sunday? Do we need a break from our serious preparations, or do we need a break from our celebrations?

Have we come to this time of Advent where we are tired of the season, and we wish it was already over? Are we already so tired that, when it comes to cutting something out, will we decide to cut a bit of our spiritual preparations? Have our Christmas decorations already been up so long that we cannot wait to take them down? Finally, a question I have struggled with over the years: Has Christmas shopping ceased being fun and become a chore for us? Does the rose candle make sense anymore? If Advent is to be a serious matter for us, then we need to notice that we are people who wait for something. What we wait for is the coming of the reign of Jesus Christ. James speaks of being patient. To make sense of this reading, we must use what is left of Advent to build a sense of anticipation for the coming of the Lord.

For the rest of Advent, we might want to be more observant, as Jesus told the disciples of John. It will allow us to recognize the importance of the rose candle in the Advent wreath.




