A Word From Our Pastor:

s we celebrate the last Sunday of Advent this year, we are introduced to two fathers in our readings. King Ahaz was the 11th King of Judah. He was, frankly, a terrible King whose rule led to the eventual downfall of Judah. Ahaz abandoned the faith of his people for political motives. To earn allies, he set up worship of gods of other countries in the Temple and throughout Judah.

In our reading this Sunday, Isaiah, sent by God, went to save Ahaz. Isaiah offered Ahaz the opportunity to ask for anything he wanted. Ahaz decided not to trust in the faithfulness of God, but rather he faked humble piety. Even with his lack of faithfulness, God still gave Ahaz a sign. The sign that God gave was that the monarchy would continue, and that Ahaz would be given an heir. Hezehkiah would be the heir and he would initiate religious reforms, but it was too late, and the kingdom was lost.

The other father we experience today is Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, who was the opposite of Ahaz. According to the Gospel of today, Joseph was a righteous man, meaning that he observed God's laws. He was also a man of great compassion. Though the woman he was to marry was pregnant, he wished her no harm. The law stipulated that Mary should have been stoned to death, but Joseph had worked out a way to divorce her quietly in order to avoid gossip, and which would allow Mary to marry the father of her child and thus save her life.

While this tells us much about Joseph, it also tells us that through a dream, Joseph enjoyed Divine communication with God. There will be a Child, and this Child will be the Heir to David's throne. The name will be an announcement of hope. God will be with Joseph in his decision to take Mary as his wife and further, the name will also be a sign of hope for everyone. God will be there for all.

Joseph connects us, on this Sunday, to the real humanness of the birth of Jesus. Though Joseph knew absolutely nothing of what lay ahead of him, by accepting a pregnant spouse, he bravely acted contrary to the socially acceptable idea of divorce.

On this last Sunday of Advent, we must recognize the actions of Joseph. He was a religious man, proud of his faith and loyal to his God. He worked hard to provide for a wife and his Son. This should give us strength and hope to say yes to God in our lives.




