A Word From Our Pastor:

Merry Christmas to all of you and to your families. It is a joy to be your parish priest and to serve all of you.

With joyful thoughts in our minds as we celebrate Christmas with the birth of Our Lord, it is a good time to ponder and remember Christmases when we were younger. All of us have special memories of that special gift, or the Christmas dinners we shared with loved ones. Perhaps some of us had Christmas traditions within our families. A tradition I remember fondly of growing up in my family, is that I would always attend with my father the 7 a.m. Christmas Mass in the parish I grew up in. My father always volunteered to usher this Mass and I would get up at 5 a.m. to open presents and then get ready for Mass. What I always remember is how dark it was outside when we arrived for the Mass, but when we left it was light outside. Perhaps this was my first introduction to the words from Isaiah in one of the readings of Christmas: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them the light has shone."

These words still give us hope to this day. Many of us can still remember a surprise gift received or someone else received and the joy that it brought. The biggest surprise for us at this moment should be the present of a baby called Messiah and Lord. How could a King be born to an itinerant couple, a Child whose first companions in life were shepherds, the lowest esteemed of labourers? This is the surprise we call Christmas.

Why a baby? A baby presents no threat to us. A baby represents only promise and possibilities. A baby lets us imagine wonderful futures. It is very easy to meet God in the form of a baby. Meeting God in the form of and adult, however, is not so easy.

The baby Jesus represents innocence and peace to us. How can we feel threatened in any way, shape, or form? The adult Jesus, however, can represent a threat. To follow Him we must reform our lives. We must change. Perhaps this is why we have a tendency to remember our Christmases of childhood. They are from a time when we did not have responsibilities. Now we have grown up and God now calls us to responsibility.

The reality is that, if we desire to meet God in our prayer and in our worship, we will be changed. The surprise which is given to us is that we will be changed into that which we should have been all along, and this will bring peace.

Once again, Merry Christmas to you and your families as we celebrate the birth of Our Saviour. Also, a blessed New Year to all.




